# COMMUNITY MINDED

#### LOCAL LIVES

Despite living in the Moutere for 21 years, Heather Marr has kept her strong Scottish accent. She moved here from Fife when her children Claire, Lauren and Elliot were youngsters, and all three went through Upper Moutere School.

Heather has worked at Country Kids day-care and preschool for 16 years, currently doing three days a week with the under-twos. She says she particularly loves writing their 'learning stories', detailing each step in their development.

These regular records of each child at the centre are kept in books and online via the Storypark app, which enables parents to view and comment on their children's activities, as well as share photos of their own.

Heather completed her degree in early childhood education six years ago, just as Elliot, then 15, was diagnosed with stage three non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. For the next eight months, all routines were thrown out the window, as Heather and Elliot were flown straight to the Children's Haematology Oncology Centre (CHOC) in Christchurch.

A month after arriving, the Christchurch earthquake struck, and Elliot was among several patients to be flown to the Starship in Auckland while power was restored at CHOC. There he had to go into isolation having caught a superbug, adding to an already traumatic time.

"The community here was amazing," recalls Heather. "A working bee built a deck for us, and the school kids fundraised at the Sarau Festival. It really took the pressure off and helped provide the 'warm fuzzies' while we were feeling so cut off from everyone."

Unlike some of the good friends he made during this period, Elliot was fortunate to make it through. Now 21, he is living in Wellington and getting stuck into photography. "He was here just a short while ago doing a photo shoot for a company that sells cycling gear," says Heather.

Lauren, 25, is a police officer in Auckland, and Claire, 27, works at Pomeroy's in Nelson. She also puts her



creative streak to practical use by baking and decorating cakes—the latest for a 50<sup>th</sup> birthday party.

Paintings and other artworks hang all around the family home: on walls and ceilings—even pegged to curtains—creating an appealingly rustic look. Heather loves to paint from her home studio, working mostly with oils and watercolours to produce landscapes, still lifes and portraits.

Her art is also on display at the Moutere Hills Vineyard, thanks to owners Rusty and Lisa, who were the first to 'purchase' her work. "I got a bar tab for my first sale," says Heather with a laugh.

Always keen to get involved in the community, she helps out each year at the Sarau Festival blackcurrant cooking competition, and she's also been the 'watchhouse' for the local fire brigade for 16 years. "As soon as the siren goes, I'm there, turning on the engines and manning the radios."







#### Horse dental care

Having regular dental check ups are essential to the on-going health of your horse.

The general health and condition of your horse starts with good nutrition, however optimising good nutrition relies on healthy teeth that do their job well for your horse - allowing effective chewing, digestion and nutrient absorption. This then creates a healthy, happy and willing companion.

#### Are bad teeth causing pain to your horse?

Horses have evolved as prey animals and as such are able to "hide" pain-indicating behaviour. This is a natural response useful to minimise the chances of being picked upon by a hungry predator. A good dental exam is the only way to make sure your horse in not suffering unnecessarily.

A horse's teeth grow continually and only slow down late in life. By the age of nine months most deciduous teeth (milk teeth) will be in wear. By five years all permanent teeth should be present.

Some common problems that can occur and often go untreated are:

- Sharp enamel points that can lacerate the cheek and tongue leading to painful ulcers.
- \* Erupted or retained wolf teeth.
- \* Retained milk teeth that can interfere with permanent teeth emergence.
- Inflamed and painful gums (developing periodontal disease).
- Dental impactions, hooks, ramps and wave mouth.

At Town and Country Vet we have the expertise (Mitch) to address many of the dental problems your horse may have. During the initial visit we will:

- Carry out a full exam, identify and treat most dental conditions including the extraction of loose and/or damaged teeth.
- Administer a preventative tetanus vaccination if necessary
- Collect blood for selenium testing if required
- Offer help on any other issue (s) you may need help with.

All our dental procedures are carried out under sedation. Sedation allows for:

A calm, stress-free, and efficient procedure.

Minimising of pain. Local anaesthetic is also used if any teeth need to be extracted.

High quality of diagnosis, followed by correct treatment.

The owner being able to observe the procedure being carried out.

Increased safety for us as vets, you as the handler and the horse.

Does sedation increase the cost of a dental? No! In fact sedation allows for a quicker procedure as much less time is spent controlling the horse. It is also important to remember that procedures such as wolf teeth and/or molar and incisor



extractions are painful to the horse and MUST ALWAYS be carried under sedation and local analgesia.

#### Hello Animal Lovers

Is it just me or does it seem that this year is flying along at a frightening pace? It is Autumn already and there is clearly a change of seasons although a lot of fruit and plants are blooming late due to the delayed hot sunny weather. I was wondering how it would affect our animal friends particularly with breeding cycles. Nevertheless there is more feed and green grass in paddock than I have seen in some years so that has to be a good thing.

Continuing with anecdotal observations with my animals this month I am focussing on my dog, Charlie. Charlie like a lot of my animals is a rescue. He came to me four years ago as a senior dog then at seven years of age, a breeding sire for cocker spaniels and no longer needed. Poor Charlie had spent his life being a breeding sire and generally contained in a cage. He had no training and no experience of so many things like traffic, other animals and people. It speaks volumes for his temperament that he has learned to successfully adapt to almost everything although he has never got over separation anxiety. When I first got him he would do almost anything to be with me. He could not be contained in my car without chewing through seatbelts and even broke a window to get out! He also has never got over the desire to hunt out hedgehogs as his previous owner allowed him to kill them. This is something I have discouraged and I have lost count of the number of hedgehogs I have rescued and rehabilitated. When Charlie finds a hedgehog he will bark at it which of course makes it curl up into a ball. He then will pick it up and carry it off. Anyone who has tried to pick up a curled hedgehog will understand how difficult this is but it does not seem to harm Charlie. However despite this little anomaly, Charlie has turned into a loving albeit exuberant companion who only wants to love and be loved. Like most cocker spaniels he loves food and fetching things that are thrown. He is super-tolerant of small children and other animals.

Charlie is an example of how, with time and patience an older dog can have another life. It is very rewarding to have achieved this with him and he now is living out his twilight years a very happy dog.

**Pet tip for the month:** If you want to establish leadership with any dog make sure to only allow them to eat when you say so. Also that you go through gates and doors first before the dog.
