

# PROJECT **PATHWAY**



e are proposing the creation of a public walking and cycle track to connect Upper Moutere village to the Moutere Hills Community Centre. It's a distance of less than 2km down the highway but currently has no safe access other than by car.

We would absolutely love for landowners to step forward and help us make the community easier and safer to get around in. As well as being a great recreational trail, the pathway would provide safe passage for school children going from the school to community centre activities. It would also provide an alternative to driving for families with school children who live near Upper Moutere School but who, since recent times, are not eligible for the school bus.

We are talking to landowners, Council, local businesses and organisations for their support, and collecting feedback from the wider community. We are not advocating any particular route for the pathway at this moment. There are three or four different ways a track could run—and each has individual advantages, disadvantages and difficulties. Also, to get from the village to the centre, every possible route would at some point require crossing private land.

We expect the final route to be chosen based on input from landowners and Council, feedback from the community, and simple feasibility. Once a practical route has been found, we can take a formal proposal to Council.

Generally, all that is needed is a three-metre wide strip of land in the right place. Some landowners have, in fact, already approached us with offers and we are exceedingly thankful to them. In the end, the pathway is most likely to go wherever we can first bridge the gaps and make a physical connection that is also practical.

The Moutere Hills Residents Association is looking for your support to create a public pathway from Upper Moutere village to the community centre.

It is envisioned that the MHRA will raise the majority of funds required to construct the pathway from donations, private fundraising, and as contributions 'in-kind' by the local community.

Once completed, the pathway would become a Council asset, like other similar walking and cycle tracks.

#### What you can do?

An easy way to show your support is to become a member of the Moutere Hills Residents Association, a not-for-profit incorporated society. You will receive all email updates and be able to vote at association meetings. Just go to www.mhra.org.nz/members/join or visit one of our meetings. We also urge you to sign the TDC petition at the centre, pub, garage, school, store and takeaway.

If you are a local business or organisation, and you think the proposed pathway is a good idea, please write us a letter of support for the project. Many local groups and institutions have already done so, and this greatly helps us in fundraising and negotiations with Council.

If you can offer any other form of contribution—especially contributions 'in-kind', such as gravel or timber, fencing, machine work, labour or other materials—let us know. We will need to be able to show what the community can contribute at the same time that we ask Council for help.



# YOU MIGHT NEED A NEW WATER TANK

Tasman District Council is proposing some changes to the Public Water Supply Bylaw in an update on the previous bylaw from 2009 which is now expiring.

Two areas where Council intend to apply and enforce bylaw requirements are a "minimum storage for customers connected to a restricted flow supply", and for customers to "comply with any water restrictions imposed because of drought, emergency, or other reason".

This will affect all users on schemes with restrictors such as the **Dovedale Water Scheme**. Be sure to check out the new storage requirements outlined in the proposed bylaw text.

In short, this will be:

- a 25,000 L tank if you receive 1-3 cubic meters per day
- 7,000 L storage for every cubic meter supplied if you receive more than that

Storage requirements must be complied with by 1 November 2018.



Hello Animal Lovers,

Well, Spring has certainly sprung and you may have noticed some strange behaviour with your animals. With the increased daylight, sun and spring growth can influence an animal's activity level dramatically. Cats will

charge around, as will dogs, horses and cows. Spring is traditionally a time for finding a mate and starting a family but this is not the whole reason for the increased activity. All animals are influenced by the electricity in the atmosphere and after colder weather and shorter days, it is a time to celebrate Spring.

The feverish activity will not last and eventually the animals will return to normal again. There are sometimes cases, however, when the new spring growth can be exceedingly influential on horses and cows behaviour. This can be remedied by limiting grazing or by feeding magnesium to counteract the toxins in the grass. In rare cases a cow or horse can be significantly affected by the toxins and veterinary advice must be sought. It is hard to know why some animals are affected and others not but it is important to observe them on a daily basis in order to take the appropriate action.

However, spring is generally a lovely time of year for animals and people and the air seems charged with possibilities, even people feel more 'alive' and it is a great time to get out and enjoy it.

#### **PLAY IT SAFE**



Something that is often overlooked with our modern anthelmintics is that some of the components have a fairly narrow safety margin. Levamisole in particular has a pretty narrow safety margin with a 2 - 3 times overdose being enough in the right circumstances to kill sheep or cattle. Abamectin can be toxic to lambs when overdosed though this issue is more commonly seen in calves. Because of their small size lambs and calves are most at risk from potential toxicity.

Large scale cases of toxicity are pretty rare but losing the odd lamb or calf after drenching may not be that uncommon. Lambs that collapse &/or show nervous signs soon after drenching could well be showing signs of levamisole &/or abamectin toxicity. Most modern combination anthelmintics contain levamisole and abamectin, sometimes both and generally don't cause problems however appreciation of the risk factors for toxicity will help you avoid the potential for this to occur.

#### These include:

**Overdosing:** Estimate liveweights accurately (use scales) and resist the temptation to give that particularly scungy lamb a double dose.

**Dehydration:** This is often a common factor in levamisole toxicity. For example drenching in hot conditions following trucking or mustering, if lambs are scouring and yarding for too long can all result in dehydration.

Rumen Bypass: Drench is designed to be swallowed into the rumen. In very young lambs the presence of liquid on the tongue can trigger a reflex (the esophageal groove reflex) which directs the drench straight to the abomasum (4th stomach) as happens when they drink milk. Drenches are then rendered more toxic because they are more rapidly absorbed from the abomasum,.. Although in most cases there is no need to drench really young lambs, (<6 weeks old) if you decide to do so, passing the drench nozzle right over the back of the tongue will help minimise rumen bypass.

Insufficient Mixing of the Drench: This can result in an inadvertent overdose of one of the drench components. Not all combination formulations are created equal and some do settle out faster than others. We stock products that have better performance in this regard but never the less – shake the drum well before decanting into your backpack.

**Heat Stress:** On really hot days, muster in the cool of the early morning – you'll reduce your incidence of enzootic pneumonia as well.

#### **CLOSTRIDIAL PROTECTION**

Lambs born to ewes not vaccinated with 5 in 1 before lambing should be given lamb vaccine at docking., This should be boosted with 5 in 1, 4-6 weeks later, in November or December. If all ewes were vaccinated, the lambs will have maternal immunity from the colostrum for about 12 weeks and the first shot needed by the lambs will be in November/ December, with a booster given 4 to 6 weeks later. At the clinic we can decanter off small amounts of vaccine so even small mobs can be vaccinated



There are plenty of lemons out there especially in the warm microclimates many of you will have in your garden. This month Soo Gee tells us how to prepare and use preserved lemons.



#### PRESERVED LEMONS

20 lemons (not Meyer), wash and cut into wedges (4-6). Press salt into the cut surface, put into a stainless steel bowl and leave for 1 -2 days in a cool place.

Remove and pack into sterilized jars with sealable lids. Cover with fresh lemon juice that has had a little boiling water added to it. Make sure lemon wedges are covered then seal. Let them stand for 3-4 weeks.

To Use: Rinse to remove some of the salt, discard flesh, cut into strips or as desired. Use in fish dishes - add lemons and a knob of butter to the pan after removing fish and use to deglaze the pan. Add to mayonnaise, risottos, couscous salads and chicken dishes. Add a little to dips for a tangy twist.

#### Gas Heaters Can Be Harmful to Health

During a particularly cold snap this winter the oil heater I have in my office simply wasn't man enough to keep the damp and cold at bay. I remembered I had an LPG fuelled gas heater lying in the man cave, so thought it would be a great comfort to set it up and roast in the glorious heat.

The first morning I fired it up and wow was I toastie. I quickly forget about it and started working through the day's business. Now they do smell a bit but I soon came to the conclusion that this was a small price to pay but after several hours I developed quite a headache. I put this down to a hard day's creft.

Back to work the next morning and the first thing I did was fire up the bad boy to melt the ice. A few hours later I began to notice the same symptoms, I also started to take note of the strong gas odour the fire gave off. I went outside to get some fresh air and when I returned it struck me that it may be the heater causing the issue. I turned it off and decided to to a bit of research. Turns out that my fire

is what's known as a unflued gas heater, and they're pretty dangerous things.

As a firefighter I am aware of the dangers a naked flame poses but was unaware of the other issues. The government list a number of health effects: Unflued gas heaters increase the level of indoor air pollutants and also the incidence of respiratory problems amongst some people in the building. Health effects from nitrogen dioxide and carbon monoxide may occur immediately at the time of exposure or they may occur sometime later.

#### Here's the advice:

- The room needs to be well ventilated.
  Keep internal doors and at least 1 window
- open to allow fresh air to enter the room.

   Check that room vents are not blocked.
- Check that room vents are not blocked.
   Never use an unflued gas heater in the
- room where you sleep, in a bathroom, caravan or tent.

   Minimise the length of time you use an
- unflued gas heater.
- Make sure your heater is installed by a licensed gas fitter.
- Have your unflued gas heater serviced by a qualified person at least once a year.




