

Ali and Keith Beasley have two teenagers—George, 18, and Emilia, who has just turned 14. The family moved from the UK to Lower Moutere in 2009, settling there for four years before shifting to Richmond to be closer to the children's schools

A diagnosis of autism for Emilia when she was seven had a profound impact on the whole family. "As parents, it felt like we had been given a destination with no map," says Ali in her new book *Emilia's Colours: The Gift of Autism*.

Ali has wanted to write the book about her experiences for many years, but the demands of special-needs parenting left her with very little time or energy. This year, she has achieved her goal, sharing the highs and lows of living with a child with a major disability in words that are honest, personal and ultimately hopeful.

From her initial feelings of shock and grief at the diagnosis, Ali says she gradually learned to develop resilience as she came to accept and even embrace Emilia's condition. And through caring for her daughter, she has discovered the importance of looking after herself as a parent, with restorative yoga becoming her 'go-to' place for inner healing.

The book begins by outlining the many and varied challenges that Emilia faces, including stress, anxiety, anger and communication difficulties. All describes the tough reality for parents trying to cope with these challenges, which have an enormous effect on family relationships and activities, and childhood friendships. "It hurts so much for Emilia and for us as parents, knowing that

these kids get excluded or do not feel popular," she says.

Ali goes on to look at the ways she and Keith have learned to seek and find support—and to describe the gifts that autism has brought them, by teaching values like patience, gratitude, courage, compassion and humour.

Emilia's Colours ends with personal impressions by close family and friends of what Emilia means to them, and the impact she has had on their own lives. Throughout the book, family photographs capture Emilia in all her colours, together with the people who love and care for her most.

Ali's good friend, professional photographer and horse lover Trudy Nicholson, has also contributed some beautiful images to the book, showing the special bond between Emilia and Trudy's beloved horse Gus.

Life with an autistic child is volatile and unpredictable, says Ali. In writing her personal story, she hopes to help other parents who may be struggling to cope. She also aims to raise awareness and a better understanding of this 'invisible' disability among those who may not have encountered autism first-hand.

"Whenever another person deals with Emilia with respect and dignity, it fills my heart," she says. "We all have a choice as to how we treat others, with or without disabilities, and everyone deserves to be treated this way."

Tugging on the Past Rosenthal at Neudorf

On a spur of the moment this month I bought the Home NZ magazine, not realising that it showcases mainly architectural builds and houses that have won awards for their innovative interiors and exteriors. When I got home and opened it I doubted I would gain any inspiration for the toilet block as we are taking such a DIY approach with limited expenses, but I was surprised to find that one of the summer getaway stories featured a hand-built Kiwi bach built in the Orongorongo Valley bush over fifty years ago. The photographs showcased the getaway's raw, unchanged features, including a concrete floor, narrow bunks, an open fireplace, makeshift kitchen, and the spectacular feeling of remoteness. This little bush hut named 'Taihoa' showcased basic holidaying at its best. It reminds me of a bach we took a group of youth group kids to a few years ago, only fifteen minutes from Lake Rotoiti, but surrounded by bush and farmland, and similarly primitive. The experience was like timetravelling, and I came home wishing I could bring some of that oldworld charm and simplicity with me.

Interestingly, the theme throughout current issues of the other home-style magazines that frequently end up in my shopping trolley is also centred around the perfect summer getaway. Many of the houses in these magazines have integrated reminders of the classic Kiwi bach. Most do not strive for such a basic experience as no insulation or electricity, but the nostalgia around those little cabins in the bush or by the beach many of us frequented as kids appears to be on a lot of people's minds at the moment.

In part due to my father's prompting, a couple of months ago I started developing a vision for the old toilet block at Neudorf. Despite its leaks, holes, kicked-in weatherboards and broken glass, I can see it as somewhere we might one day be able to get away for the summer. Fix up its weatherboards, add some French doors, and it would have a lovely country cottage vibe. Somewhere quiet to relax and enjoy watching the kids run around in so much space.

It's certainly not looking anything like the dream in my head yet. But after several hours of work, a perilous trek across the region with a set of second-hand French doors, and some patches of new paintwork, my husband is starting to see the future of this little cabin, too. He views the project as an old-style bach similar to 'Taihoa' in *Home NZ* with the bare necessities: basic plumbing, little or no electricity, and no insulation. On a strict budget we will furnish it with bargain finds from the transfer station or Trademe, further hitting home the feeling of the classic Kiwi bach. It probably won't be warm enough for a year-round holiday house, especially with young children in tow. But it will be very satisfying, when we are there, waking up with the dawn, enjoying a simpler lifestyle looking at the world instead of a screen, and leaning out of the French doors to pick veggies from our garden on the old foundations.






For ten years we have been pursuing our dream of creating a small family vineyard and winery where everything from harvesting, making the wine, corking and finally labelling is undertaken by the family, with the help of friends and neighbours. The vineyard is called Mahana hills and we call our wine Five Rows (there were only five initially). We also decided to plant new varieties to Nelson in the form of Semillon -Spanish white, Gamay Noir - French red, Tempranillo - Spanish red and recently Lagrein - Italian red. Current prices are:-Red Wines from \$20, White wines from \$15. We use traditional wine making techniques with the bare minimum of sulphites, and no filtration or fining. The wines are matured in French Oak barrels for a minimum of one year. We are now making more wine than we can drink so we need some local help.

Our Five Rows wine club is designed specifically for locals. Our wine is only available at the cellar door and club members will receive a 10% discount on all our prices including the multibuy discounts. Membership is free and easy by simply emailing us at <a href="mailto:ma



Mapua Playcentre

We're running a series of family profiles over the coming months to introduce some of our playcentre families and what they love about playcentre. This is from Mereana who comes with her son Paddy, 4.

Paddy and I moved to Ruby Bay from Wellington about six months ago, prompted mainly by the weather and the lure of family, but also a desire to find a smaller community to be part of.

I was a Playcentre child growing up but hadn't managed to find a Playcentre for Paddy near to where we lived in Wellington. So, it was a treat for me to find a Playcentre in Mapua and for it to run a session on Friday morning, which is the only day I don't work.

Right from the outset, Paddy embraced Playcentre. He loves looking after – or 'directing' – the younger children and spends almost all his time in the sandpit. For me, I have really appreciated how warm and welcoming the other playcentre parents are. I've made some good friends within a short period of time and think this has a lot to do with how supportive and inclusive the Playcentre community is. It has definitely eased my transition into a new place!

Mapua Playcentre has been a prominent place for families in the Mapua community for over 60 years. We have a qualified supervisor on each session and we love having visitors so please feel welcome to drop in at any time and find out what Kiwi families have been embracing for generations.








Chickens as pets



Why have chickens?

Eggs! Or meat if you'd prefer. Fresh eggs are much tastier than store bought and chickens will produce about one egg each per day throughout the warmer months, on average 240 eggs per year.

Leftover eaters - while you can't feed only scraps if your chickens are laying, they are omnivores and will eat most I e f t o v e r f o o d y o u o f f e r . Good for your lawn/garden- chickens will eat pests and grass, and produce nitrogen rich fertiliser. Adding egg shells and faeces to your compost will give it a huge boost.

Chickens have huge personalities and will soon learn to come when called, and can even be taught tricks (search chicken clicker training on YouTube...)

Chickens are beautiful! They come in all shapes and sizes. 'Bantam' breeds are smaller if that is an advantage, do some research to decide which is best for you.

They are low maintenance. Pick up eggs daily, feed and water them every other day and clean out their bedding monthly.

What do I need to know?

Chickens need a coop to nest in, and a run if not free range. Seven chickens /m2 is the smallest area they should have access to (not including a run). There should be one nest box per 4 hens and rounded perches with enough space for fit a t A free range hen will eat grass, scraps, insects, and will need supplementing with grains or pellets, which contain grains, protein, fat, vitamins and minerals. Calcium in the form of limestone flour needs to make up 4-5% of a layers diet as they put a lot of calcium into egg shells. Avocado, green potatoes, rhubarb leaves, parsnip, parsley and celery are all poisonous to chickens so shouldn't be fed. Sick chickens can be picked out from healthy chickens by one or more of these symptoms: Fluffed feathers, separation from the flock, soiled feathers or diarrhoea, lameness, breathing with an open beak, red skin and feather loss, (though chickens do moult yearly in autumn), swelling o f legs o r o f the Talk to us at Town and Country Vet if you are concerned at about the health o f your Lastly a note on ex-battery hens- hens that are bred to lay are usually only kept till 16 months old and then are replaced, but often still have many eggs and years left in them. While these birds take a while to adjust to being backyard chooks they can be very rewarding. Give them time, food, warmth and some general tender loving care and they will soon be great pets.


