# LOCAL LIVES

Thanks to a successful funding application to Sarau Trust and Lions foundation, a new pump and jump track opened behind the church hall in late February.

Located right next to the recently completed skate ramp, it is open during daylight hours to anyone wanting to try out their bike moves.

The Moutere Community Youth Trust is behind the new track, with local Youth Workers Tessa and Billy Werner seeing the project through to completion.

"A BMX track made by previous youth workers needed moving from what had once been church land," explains Billy. "The current owners of the land had kindly let us continue using the track, but were now planning to plant hops—so it was a good time to use the dirt to create the new pump track.

Billy came up with the design himself and the funding was used for diggers to move the dirt. "A local family lent us their digger for the day and we hired two more."

Local youngsters Jody Stow and Ryan Smith (both keen bikers) also got involved, helping with the planning, shovelling and shaping of the track to ensure it was smooth and well formed.

Billy hopes to see it getting plenty of use by young people in the area. When he's not doing his job as an outdoor instructor, he shares the Youth Worker role with wife Tessa. They have been in the role for three years now, with a seven-month break in Switzerland to be with Billy's mother.

As well as doing chaplaincy and team building work within schools, plus running holiday programmes and camps, Tessa and Billy hold junior, intermediate and senior Youth Group sessions at the church hall on Fridays.

"We do all sort of different activities suited to each age group," says Billy. "For the seniors, we recently drove the van to Rabbit Island for some orienteering and a BBQ."

The couple moved to the Moutere from the North Island to take up their current roles. For Tessa, it was familiar ground as she had grown up here and one of her forefathers was the original pastor of St Paul's Community Church.

It's a neat link for a couple now thoroughly involved in the local community—particularly in providing youngsters with some great activities like the new pump track.

#### A thought on Easter from Andy

This year, Resurrection Sunday, the day most Christians would point to as being the most significant celebration of their faith falls on April 1st or April Fool's Day. "How very apt!" some of you may be saying to yourselves. I imagine the women who went to tend to the body of Jesus, who came back announcing that Jesus was in fact alive again, would have been greeted or treated like many April fool's prankster whose claims were so wildly over the top that any 'fool' could see through their story. The writer to the early church in Corinth further reinforced this when he said that the message of the cross was foolishness. But for those who believe, the message of the cross is full of beauty and power, because it is at the cross that God announces to the world once and for all that he is done with the problem of sin and declares forgiveness for the God killer in all of us. Historically the church has been pretty poor at presenting this message; while doing a great job of making people feel 'bad about themselves', or even better making people who fell feel even worse. And the church wonders why people don't seem to think that their message is good news. Hearing that God loves you and has done away with the problems that sin had created should sound more like someone yelling out "The drinks are on me!" rather than "Time to pay up- and don't forget the GST."

This Easter we will be celebrating that message- that God's got the bill and it's never too late to join the party!

After summer, our freezers were completely empty, but we're happy to report they're now fully restocked and ready to be rolled on out!



# **April Holiday Activities 2018**

The holidays are on the horizon - how on earth are you going to fill your days? Here are five ideas of what we are going to do during the first week of the school holidays.

Recipe by Soo Gee

#### *Ingredients:*

3kg green tomatoes, cut into wedges

5 onions, sliced

500gm treacle

2tbsp curry powder

2tbsp mustard

2 lts malt vinegar

5 tbsp flour

1tbsp salt

#### *Method:*

Put tomatoes and onions in large pot. Add curry powder, mustard, salt and vinegar. Bring to boil. Cook gently for 1 hour.

Mix flour with extra vinegar and add to chow chow. crumbs. Stir and cook for further 20 mins, stirring occasionally. Pour into hot jars and seal.

You can make this with a mixture of vegetables eg cauliflower, beans, cucumber, broccoli, etc.

Ingredients:

Green tomatoes

Egg

Milk

Flour

Breadcrumbs (optional)

#### Method:

Cut tomatoes 2cm thick. Beat an egg and a little milk. Coat tomatoes in flour and dip into egg mixture. Repeat. Coat again in flour and/or breadcrumbs.

Fry in hot oil. This dish is nice with chutney or yoghurt with chopped gherkins.



#### Rabbits and the new strain of calicivirus (K5)

The Ministry of Primary Industries has approved the release of a new strain of calicivirus or Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease virus (RHD) to help manage the pest rabbit population.

It is going to be released in Canterbury, Otago and Marlborough in autumn 2018 but is expected to spread beyond these areas over time as one of the main ways RHD is spread is by flies which can travel long distances. RHD is also easily passed between infected rabbits, exposure to dead rabbits, on food bowls and bedding and through fly 'spots' (faeces). Only a tiny dose of virus is necessary to cause disease in rabbits. The virus is difficult to kill and survives in the environment for months.

<u>Symptoms</u>: The main symptom we see is sudden death. A normal healthy rabbit can die within hours. Rabbits can be unwell for a longer period of time but still usually die.

<u>Treatment</u>: There is no specific treatment for affected rabbits. Supportive treatment such as fluids and warmth may help a milder case.

<u>Prevention</u>: Cylap vaccine is available for vaccination against the older strain of calicivirus (v351). The manufacturers do not claim that it is effective against K5. However information from Australia indicates that Cylap will protect rabbits against K5.

For rabbits 12 weeks and older: one vaccination followed by annual boosters


For rabbits less than 12 weeks old: first vaccination at 10-12 weeks old then a booster 4 weeks later followed by annual boosters. (This protocol can also be used for rabbits living in high risk areas e.g. living rurally with wild rabbits.)

Other ways to reduce the risk of calicivirus infection:

- Control insects especially flies and fleas indoors and outdoors
- · Remove uneaten food and clean out soiled bedding daily
- · Consider keeping pet rabbits indoors
- Rabbit-proof your garden to keep wild rabbits out
- Regularly clean cages, hutches, bowls with 10% bleach (10 minutes contact time is required then rinse off)
- Limit contact with unfamiliar pet rabbits
- Wash hands and clothing after handling other rabbits/before handling yours
- Avoid cutting grass/weeds and feeding them to your rabbit if there is risk of contamination from wild rabbits.

NB Please be aware that Cylap vaccine comes in 10ml vials which provides 1ml doses for 10 rabbits. Once opened the vaccine must be used within 10 hours. In our clinic we vaccinate rabbits on the first Tuesday of every month. However due to increased demand at the moment, we are doing extra days – please phone the clinic on 544 1200 if you would like more information.
