Sam Lowe has been to every Sarau Festival since moving to Upper Moutere eight years ago and enjoys it so much she has now taken charge of the event.

The gymnastics coach is looking forward to building on the festival's past success after its founder and organiser for the past 11 years, Jenny Leith, handed over the reins.

Sam and some of her helpers are already busy organising, seeking sponsors and developing fresh ideas for the 2019 event, which will be held on Sunday, February 3.

"Jenny has done an amazing job over the years and will still be a key part of making the event happen," Sam says.

"I only hope I can build on that and deliver a terrific festival that draws in people from across the region come the Nelson anniversary weekend next summer."

Sam is already known to dozens of parents and children in the area for running Tasman Gymnastics Club, which operates out of the Moutere Hills Community Centre and the Motueka Memorial Hall.

She hopes to pull more people in the community together by getting them to help in the build-up to Sarau, and to also come along and enjoy the annual festival itself.

"I've always had a great time at Sarau, whether at first as a visitor, or in recent years helping the event set-up and pack down, running the Kidz Zone or in other helping roles," Sam says.


"It's such a lovely occasion where you can catch up with people in a relaxed atmosphere, try some different food and drink, buy some nice things and just have a fun time.

"For 2019 it would be marvellous to see even more locals taking time out to make Sarau happen; either in the weeks beforehand, on the day or with the big tidy-up the day after.

"The festival cannot happen without our fantastic band of volunteers, so any extra assistance is always welcome. Plus, the bigger and better the Sarau Festival is, the more money goes back into the Moutere community and helps this area to be the wonderful place that it is."

Each year the festival raises thousands of dollars and that money goes into the Sarau Community Trust, which allocates it to local organisations. Since 2011, the trust has allocated more than \$170,000 to different groups and individuals.




The Tasman District Council is searching for a way to close the \$26mln funding gap for the Waimea Dam by December 2018.







#### Report on New Zealand Secondary Schools Football Under-15 Tour to Malaysia

I started playing football for the Moutere Rangers at 7 years old, with my first ever coach being Yvette Cook. Now I play for Nelson College in the under-17 league. Last April, from 65 nominees around the country I was chosen as one of the 24 trialists to go to a 3 day residential training camp at Massey in Palmerston North. From that they selected a squad of 18 to travel to Malaysia to represent the NZ Secondary Schools in the Under-15 team.

When the 36-page document of risk management arrived in the mail, I said to Mum, "I'm not reading this, I'm sure there's a video somewhere that I can watch and learn from." Later, after I had read the whole document, my parents told me to watch a video explaining exactly what I had just spent ages reading, so of course I argued and said, "Why couldn't I have just watched this?" But everyone knows what parents are like, trying to talk to them is like trying to talk to a brick wall. Anyway, some of the main points the document made were, don't drink the tap water, you must drink at least 5 litres of bottled water a day, stay away from animals because they might have rabies etc.

We arrived in Kuala Lumpur after an 11 hour flight and were greeted with mid 30° temperatures. Each of us were given what was the equivalent of \$30NZD a day and when you're shopping in Malaysia, that money goes a long way. For example, one night we went to Chinatown, where I picked up a Louis Vuitton backpack for only 50RM (\$18NZD).

Apart from playing football, some of the activities we did over there consisted of things like white water rafting, going up the Petronas Towers (which used to be the world's tallest towers), visiting a theme park with the biggest wave pool in the world and going to the Batu Caves, which was home to monkeys that want whatever you're holding, oh yeah they had rabies too, but we all made it out unscathed.

So, after everything Malaysia had to offer, we ended up coming home with 3 wins and 3 losses, which is very good considering Malaysia has over 30 million people, plus the teams we played were all under-16's. I now have a dozen or so new friends and a whole lotta memories that I will never forget.

Thanks to the Sarau Trust for assisting with the funding for the trip, appreciate it.



So, with Dot's encouragement the Moutere Artisans was born. Today the tightly bound group considers this sort of co-operative marketing a much easier and community based answer.



"Upper Moutere is a special place – each of the 16 artisans is a high achiever in their field. Look at Neudorf Mushrooms – they supply New Zealand's top restaurants. Peckham's Cider are Champion producers, add in the style of Katie Gold and Owen Bartlett ceramics and then there is the wine, Neudorf Vineyards has created a world wide reputation for Chardonnay and Pinot – a fact they put down to the Moutere clays, along with Kahurangi, Himmselfeld and Harakeke. Moutere Hills Café and Vineyard and the Moutere Inn are renowned for their food. After lunch pick up a punnet of new season's strawberries and for coffee head to Michael MacMillan gallery to see an inspired studio and gallery with extraordinary sculpture and French inspired homewares and Neudorf Olive oil is proudly sold in the country's best delicatessens.

Dave Barrett at Thorveld is famous for sheep's milk cheese and yoghurts. A new member of the collective is Tanya Doty from Heartstone Basketry. She uses local pine needles and willow to craft beautiful heirloom baskets. Together these people live and work in the village and this annual open day is a chance to bring friends out to the Moutere to show them why we live in this blessed area.


The Artisans have enjoyed a great deal of media attention, including articles in NZ Geographic, Kiaora Magazine and a four-page feature in Cuisine magazine.



Organisation is underway at Neudorf...the concert comes when Nelson is full of tourists and friends, so it will be a huge night."

### Kiwi Possum Productions bring their latest play to the Moutere

"Previous productions: Poison and Purity, Goodnight Irene, The Cave Above the Pa, Ted, Poppy and WW11, A Brief History of Madness, The Measures Taken and Helen & the Ferals.

Whenua/DP7 LOT 123 is a play about the land. Whenua means the womb, that which nurtures; DP7 LOT 123 means it has been surveyed and divided into parcels to be bought and sold and speculated upon.

Kevin and Rose, a retired farming couple reminisce, uneasy with the modern world. Their son, Ron has taken over the farm but wants out. His marriage has failed and one of his children has gone to the city. The other child is buried in the mountain. A Palestinian milker thinks of home. A Chinese entrepreneur hovers, as does a water bottler. A Greenie has moved into the area...

For this play, as writer, Paul Maunder states, 'the most literary and lyrical we have so far done', the group has established an intimate theatre upstairs at the Regent in Greymouth.

As a new innovation, the group will stage a house production in Jane and Pat's home on Sat Sept 8th. This is the ultimate experiment."

There's room for an audience of 12 so ring us if you're interested.

#### Blackball Readers and Writers Festival at Labour Weekend

The inaugural Blackball Readers and Writers Festival, to be held at Labour Weekend, will bring established writers to the Coast to read from their work and to have conversations. The festival will be modelled on the underground coal mine and will therefore seek work 'from the underground' which can be interpreted in many different ways e.g. that which has been forgotten, or that which has become for a time, marginal, or that which has deep roots in the earth or the past. There is also the theme of 'discussion in the bathhouse'; miners while washing up discussed politics and other matters. There will, for each festival, be book sales of the authors present and other works of relevance. There will be a writing exercise for all participants and the organisers are introducing the topic of important letters in people's lives, encouraging all participants to bring along one such letter for sharing.

For the inaugural Festival, the writer, Jean Devanny (1894-1962) will be 'recovered' and her life celebrated by historian and author Carol Dawber and author and film-maker Katherine Gallagher. Jean Devanny born in Golden Bay was a prolific (17 published novels) feminist and socialist writer and political orator. Jean, controversial and revolutionary was one of the first woman to write significant West Coast fiction. The celebrated Blackball-bred poet, Jeffrey Paparoa Holman will launch his memoir, *Now when it rains*. Acclaimed poet Tusiata Avia, born in Christchurch to the first wave of Samoan immigrants will discuss and read from her work. Dunedin novelist, Paddy Richardson will talk about her writing and her detour from the crime fiction genre with her recent novel set in Blackball. Making the underground literal, *Caves: Exploring New Zealand's Subterranean Wilderness* will be discussed by Neil Silverwood the book's photographer. To conclude the festival sessions, environmental writer Kennedy Warne will introduce the work of Denniston poet, Leicester Kyle and discuss the relationship between the poetic voice and guardianship of the environment. Kennedy author of two children's books and NZ Geographic co-founder and writer will have spent Friday talking to local school children. Z)

#### MAPUA PLAYCENTRE

The following was written by our education officer Fiona Walker:

At Mapua Playcentre we are really excited to be offering the new Playcentre qualification, Playcentre Introductory Award, starting this month right here in Mapua. It is a short 8 session course which focuses on play in early years learning and how parents can support their children's play. Researchers are learning more and more about how important play is to children all the time. The Playcentre Introductory Award gives parents the chance to work together with experienced and inspiring educators to understand more about how learning occurs through play, how to set up rich environments to inspire learning through play, and how to observe what learning is occurring. Parents who enjoy this course will soon be able to move on to another new short course, the Playcentre Education Award, and if they choose, to NZQA approved certificate or diploma in Early Childhood Education and Care.

It is amazing to see the new skills parents gain on these courses in action: the ability to steer children from conflict to problem solving, for example, and the exciting range of inviting play set ups that parents create for children on session at Playcentre and at home too. One of my favourites was a rainbow waterfall made using milk bottles, food colouring and a set of steps that had my 4 year old returning to it week after week, intrigued as to how the colours blended as the water trickled.

All Playcentre members are eligible for these free courses. And even better, at Mapua Playcentre, to acknowledge the skills and enthusiasm parents bring to sessions once they have completed the course, parents who have completed the Playcentre Introductory Award do not have to play fees for the rest of their time at Mapua Playcentre (children under 2 can attend free before you complete the course).

Come and check Mapua playcentre out. We offer a term of free sessions for first time families and all children under two are free. Session times are Mondays and Fridays 9:30am - 12 noon during school terms. You can find us at 84 Aranui Road (behind the tennis courts by the scout den). 75gm butter – melted 1/2 cup flour 1 tsp salt and 1/2 tsp pepper 1/2 cup to 1 cup preserved veg stock 2 tsp prepared horseradish sauce 1 1/2 cups grated cheddar cheese

1 1/2 cups grated cheddar cheese 2 cups of milk

Add the flour to the melted butter in a pot, stirring. Cook for 5 minutes slowly. Add milk and bring to the boil. Add 1/2 cup of vegetable stock. Bring back to the boil and add cheese. Season, add horseradish. You can add more stock if needed.

Meanwhile, lightly cook vegetable of your choice (I use broccoli).

Also, you can add a little bacon, pre-cooked and a pastry case.

# Alzheimer's Disease in pets – is your dog or cat having "senior moments"?!

Yes our pets can develop degenerative brain disease too although we don't actually call it Alzheimer's. The disease is known as **Canine or Feline Cognitive Dysfunction** and some of the changes in the brain are the same as those seen in humans with Alzheimer's. These changes result in confusion, memory loss and reduced activity. Owners often assume these changes are a normal part of aging. But actually if we recognize the symptoms we can intervene and help our pets have quality of life for longer.

Symptoms seen with Cognitive Dysfunction:

**Disorientation** – e.g. when your pet goes to the wrong side of the door or stands still staring at the wall or gets stuck behind the couch and can't figure out how to get out.

**Interactions** – e.g. when your dog stops barking at the postie or is less interested in walks or your cat is grumpy about being handled when they used to enjoy it.

Sleep/wake – e.g. when your dog or cat is restless and barks/meows persistently at night for no obvious reason

House-soiling – when a previously well-trained pet starts toileting inside

**Altered activity** – e.g. when your dog stops greeting you at the door or your cat starts sleeping in odd places

All these symptoms can be seen with other diseases. It may be that they have arthritis or kidney problems that mean they can't get outside in time to toilet, or they may be losing their hearing which means they don't hear the postie, staring into space could be a mild seizure. So it's important to rule out other physical reasons for a change in behavior. We do a thorough clinical exam to check for any sign of disease or pain and run diagnostic tests such as blood samples and x-rays. If disease is detected, treatment of the disease can help resolve behavioural changes as well. If no disease is detected, symptoms are more likely due to degenerative changes in the brain. Fortunately there are many things we can do to help our aging pets maintain good mental function for as long as possible – the sooner you intervene the better the results.


**Diet** – certain foods are formulated to help brains work better for longer. They usually contain anti-oxidants and omega-3 fatty acids which are good for cell health. Hills b/d is proven to help dogs with cognitive deterioration.

**Environmental enrichment** – by keeping our pets physically and mentally active, we can slow brain deterioration – just like in people! Rather than letting your dog sleep the day away in their bed, walk or drive them to the park for some interaction with other dogs and people. Use a treat ball so they have to work at getting a snack. Play hide and seek. Feed your cat in different places. Take them outside while you are gardening and let them find their way back in. Add a ramp up to their favourite bed. Grow some catnip. Put a bed at window height so they can see out.


Combining an enhanced diet with environmental enrichment gives the best results.

**Supplements and medications** – just like in people there are compounds such as fish oils, coconut oil, SAMe and resveratrol that keep brain cells happier for longer. We also have prescription medicines that can help.

Don't let your old pet fade away – there's a lot we can do to help!






