Come Labour Weekend Sunday, you're invited to visit one of the most productive small villages in the country.

It is Upper Moutere, home of the Moutere Artisans—a bunch of 19 creative people who got together about 10 years ago to promote this picturesque village. Their tagline is 'people who make really, really nice stuff'.

Labour Day Sunday is their traditional Open Day, when everyone is invited into their studios and galleries, their vineyards and olive groves.

This year, they welcome four new artisans, including Miles and Steph Drewery at The Sausage Press, makers of traditional salamis, pork and fennel sausages, smoked salmon and duck breast; and Robyn and Gareth Evans of St Pauli vineyard, based around an old hop kiln.

Robyn and Gareth hope to have their new cellar door open by Labour Weekend, but if it doesn't happen, they will be pouring their wine at the Moutere Inn, New Zealand's oldest pub, famous for its selection of craft beers. Peckham's traditional ciders (champion drop produced from their Moutere cider apple orchard) will also be on tap.

Along Neudorf Road, Noel and Teena Jelsma have started production of black garlic puree and essence—healthy, deeply tasty and intriguing.

At the Old Post Office in the heart of the village, you will find New Zealand fine jeweller Stacey Whale, who uses gold, silver and precious gemstones to create innovative, modern work with a feminine twist.

Stacey shares the Old Post Office space with Moutere Gold, makers of the best passionfruit curd in the west, and Tanya Doty of Heartstone Baskets, who uses local willow and supplejack to create useful yet artful baskets.

Across the road, Katie Gold and Owen Bartlett work magic with clay to create both domestic and collectable artwork.

Neudorf Road is a continuing source of joy with Thorvald cheese, where Dave and his French cheesemaker Francis produce both hard and washed rind cheese.

These stunning cheeses deserve their place on Michael MacMillan's French Oak cheese boards, created with used barrels from Neudorf Vineyards. Michael is fearsomely talented, working with bronze, wood and metal.

Neudorf Olives grove is as magnificent as any movie set. Taste the new season's olive oil and climb to the top of the hill to look over the province. Then it's time to drop into Neudorf Mushrooms for an extraordinary lesson in the life of fungi. Nothing compares to their collection of gourmet mushrooms, which they grow under their trees.

Change the pace with a visit to Terra Nova Alpacas. Quiet and friendly, these charming animals produce the finest fleece, which Donna turns into soft, floaty shawls.

The Moutere is also famous for wine. Visit and enjoy Moutere Hills, Himmelsfeld—with its quaint chapel on site—Neudorf Vineyards and Flaxmore. Flaxmore have recently added a gallery to their cellar door experience, along with a vineyard walk.

For lunch, Forsters, next to Moutere Hills, is an elegant respite in your busy day, or try a Moutere Pizza using local Artisans' produce at the pub.

Visit the Artisans from 10am until 4pm on Sunday 25^{th} October—it is a day full of treasures.


If you have trouble testing them and/or changing batteries please give our chief Fred Ewers a ring, and we will organise one of our members to help you out. We will also install alarms for you!





EASY DO-ABLE GAMES AND ACTIVITIES TO HELP BUILD BEAUTIFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Here are a few more ideas shared from my "Adventures in Natural Learning Handbook"

LONG. LONG WORDS

Write a long word on the top of a piece of paper and have player work out smaller words from that one. NB this is a great list to use for children who particularly like spelling games. Here are some of the 90 long words listed in the Handbook:

surroundings hippopotamus contentment luminescence onomatopoeia unencumbered characterisation hydroelectricity amphitheatre

achievements
exclamation
circumnavigation
complementary
superabundant
industrialisation
hieroglyphics
telecommunications

REMADE BOARD BOOKS

Get old board books in clean condition. Using a glue stick (it doesn't make the paper go wet and gluggy) firmly glue blank paper onto each page. When the paper is dry write or draw a simple story or stick photos or premade stickers on – either with words underneath or just the pictures. Because board books don't have many pages your story will be quite short and enjoyed a lot if it's about your child!

NUMBERS IN THE BOX

(This is a great game to play using whiteboards.) Each number prepares a playing sheet thus: draw a box with an open side. Around the

box draw 15 small circles. Inside each circle randomly number from 1 – 15. Swap playing sheets with friend. Now try to draw a line from the circles, starting with number 1 and finishing with number 15, into the box. Lines must not cross or touch. If they do, you lose a point. Start with 15 points and see how many you can keep.

PING PONG MINI-GOLF

Using a wooden spoon, move a ping pong ball from one end of the room to the other. Now try moving the ball along a course made from wooden blocks, or marked out with straws, rope, string, wool, or up a cardboard ramp, under books or along a line made by a rug. You can also try moving the ping pong ball using your nose or blowing through a straw!

COVER THE NUMBERS

This is a game for two players. Each has a piece of paper with 9 squares drawn in a line. Each square is numbered 1, 2, 3 etc. Each player has 9 buttons or counters of some sort.

First player rolls 2 dice. Use the score to split up and cover your numbers with buttons/counters. i.e., roll a total of 8 – you could cover boxes 1, 2 and 5; or 1, 3 and 4; or 1 and 7; or 2 and 6; or just the box marked number 8. After numbers 7, 8 and 9 are covered players just throw one die.

These ideas are not just for children - many adults enjoy them, and they're excellent for professional team-building session!





minute. This is critical for infants, young children, the elderly, pregnant women and people with weakened immune systems.' (Ministry of Primary Industries)

LOW CARBON LIFESTYLES



Be inspired and see how you could re-imagine your life—join a tour of climate-friendly properties and see ways to make positive contributions to climate action.

A tour of two local properties that have many low carbon features is happening on October 10, part of a series of three tours, two of which were in September. A low carbon lifestyle is characterised by climate-friendly activities that reduce carbon emissions and/or capture carbon from the atmosphere and store it in nature's carbon sinks, and the properties featured on these tours do just that. Carbon reduction solutions seen will undoubtedly surprise many people, as most are simple and practical, that anyone can do. Many people will leave the tour full of ideas for what they could do to make a positive contribution to climate action.

The tour on Saturday October 10 is at Jester House and a property in Lower Moutere. Jester House, probably best known for its cafe and innovative garden environment, is also a superb example of low carbon living. Features at Jester are the earth buildings, solar power, solar hot water and heating, the Wiggly Wog's living roof and low cost construction. Gardens and fruit trees are extensive in a permaculture system and surplus produce is shared via a roadside stall. Use of various forms of waste - glass, composting toilets, food - are illustrated. Extensive tree planting and timber from trees planted on bare land 30 years ago will be seen, as well as a simple biochar kiln and description of biochar production.

The second property on this tour has a large organic garden and orchard that supports 11 people. Garden management applies regenerative agriculture principles. One of the hosts will talk about her fermented foods and how she uses biochar, and another will showcase his low emissions stove, both a cooker and space heater, that burns waste and wet wood, and also produces biochar.

Previous tours - the first, on Saturday 26 September, was in and around Motueka, and included four properties that illustrate a wide variety of climate change reversal solutions in both town and country environments. At Atamai Community in the Motueka Valley, visitors saw and heard about the climate benefits of passive solar houses, solar hot water and heating, solar electricity, organic gardens and terraced orchards, an underground food cellar, foods preserved by different methods, practical use of recycled materials, ways of reducing and using waste, and efficient water use. All part of minimal consumption lifestyles that support plant-rich eating, sharing surplus food, and a community ethos for shared transport. Returning to Motueka, the third property featured a productive permaculture garden full of vegetables, fruit trees and chooks. The host's description of her transforming a

previously conventional landscaped shrubs/lawn site to its current form was both warming and motivating. This garden is a superb example of the possibilities of using your land to produce food and what you could achieve if you changed your mindset and gave away your lawn mower. The fourth visit was to a Motueka home that generates its own solar hot water and electricity, has goats that are managed with climate-friendly regenerative agriculture methods, a productive organic garden that illustrates efficient irrigation and water conservation, and extensive use of recycled materials throughout. A teenager in this household grows asparagus for sale on a road-side stall. For both site hosts in Motueka, transport within the town is via bikes with trailers.

The second tour, Sunday 27 September, was of two properties in Ngatimoti, that again illustrate many examples of low carbon living and climate change reversal solutions. Both have solar hot water and electricity generation, efficient water storage and distribution, composting toilets, and underground cellars. Plentiful organic gardens and orchards illustrate many regenerative agriculture techniques on a domestic garden scale, and cattle and sheep are similarly managed in paddocks and among the trees. Forestry on these properties, significant carbon sinks, have both exotic and native plantings. Old man's beard clearing and regenerating native species are companion activities within the forestry blocks. An exhibit of plant based foods will be shown on the tour. The site host is happy to share their knowledge and answer questions.







Drenching

Springtime provides the perfect conditions for parasites to flourish. So it's the time of year when having a good drenching programme for your stock is essential. There are many factors that isn't fearful can help a scared pet relax. And if possible, it that influence drench choice and frequency such as the species is better to remain relaxed rather than stressing about your being treated, age, lactation, stocking density, weather pet's behaviour and behaving anxiously yourself. conditions....

Factors that predispose to worm problems include:

High stocking rate

Forcing stock to graze close to the ground

One species only

Young stock

Stock in poor body condition/poor nutrition

Stress stock (e.g. lack of shelter, other disease)

Warm humid weather

Factors that reduce worm problems:

Low stocking rate Longer pasture Mixed species grazing Healthy well-fed stock

Cold frosty or very hot dry weather

In recent years, a lot of progress has been made in understanding how to control worms but it's a complicated subject partly due to the widespread problem of drench resistance.

Blanket drenching everything increases the chance of drench resistance as well as possibly being unnecessary and therefore a waste of time and money. So sometimes we do Faecal Egg

Counts to determine parasite numbers and whether you need to drench. We can also do larval cultures to diagnose the parasite species present so you drench with the most effective product.



Fireworks

Some animals are not bothered by fireworks but others can be extremely stressed. If you have a pet that's freaked out by fireworks, it is more effective to prevent (or at least reduce) their exposure to noise and lights than it is trying to calm them when they are panicking. Move your pet into a familiar room and close curtains before sunset. Then play music or turn on the TV before fireworks start. Having another pet in the room

If you plan ahead, Adaptil and Feliway are very helpful for reducing stress but have to be started at least a week or two before they're needed. Rescue Remedy, Calmex and similar remedies may also help when started ahead of time. Thundershirts are effective for many pets. Sometimes we prescribe medication to help calm pets - this requires a checkup in the clinic and should also be done ahead of time.

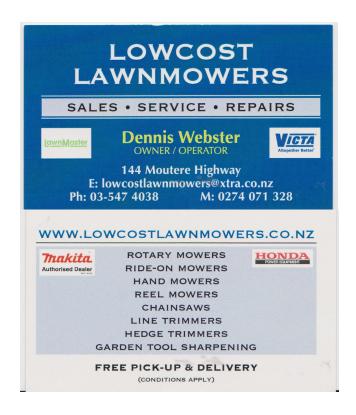
