> For now, though, Gerry is flat out with the new factory, making beef, chicken, vegetable and salmon croquettes to sell to cafés and catering companies throughout New Zealand-including Fresh Choice in Richmond. He also makes and sells a traditional Dutch sausage called frikadel: a skinless pork and beef deep-fried sausage, which he says is best served with raw onions, mustard and mayo.

> "Every batch of snacks I produce, I sample," he says. "The whole family loves them too, and a tasting session has become our Friday event!"

> The new venture has been a big change for the whole family, but Gerry says they're already feeling quite at home, thanks to the community spirit of the Moutere. "The people we've met have been fantastic," he says.



ONE HAIL OF A DAY

It was a Boxing Day that few will forget.

We headed home after enjoying a quiet one in the sun at Mapua to witness the worst hail storm in local memory.

We watched in surprise as the storm clouds gathered and the first hailstones fell. Surprise which turned to awe, and then to horror as the storm intensified and continued on, and on, and on.... There was nothing to be done as the maelstrom thundered through. The scene was reminiscent of a Central Otago snow storm, though these were not softly falling snowflakes, these were hard marble sized balls of ice being flung from the skies as if determined to cause destruction, and they did! We watched in disbelief and couldn't help but shed tears for our neighbours and their devastated crops.

Then it subsided and in its wake was an eerie blanket of white as far as the eye could see, with drifts of ice piled by the dining room door.

The next day dawned fine and calm, a mask for the feelings of disappointment and despair that floated in the air, as growers were out counting the cost of just how much havoc had been wreaked in such a short space of time, some had fared better than others. But none of us like to work for nothing, and that is now the reality for some – a years' worth of work gone in one afternoon. It's heartbreaking. As one local said 'Mother Nature gave us a White Christmas, with a cruel hand'.

We all thought that 2020 had given us her worst, but not so....and the sad irony of it all – some growers who were worried about not having enough staff to harvest their crops now have little or no crops to harvest.



Restoring the Moutere Update for January 2021

Elliot Easton has been employed by Tasman Environmental Trust to project manage both planting and fencing funding. Elliot was raised and resides in the Moutere Catchment.

We have developed a planting list and have more than 130,000 plants sourced for next year from 6 local nurseries for planting next year that are free to Moutere Landowners.

We have sent out a survey of landowners, for which we have contacts in the Moutere Catchment in order to find out what plants they would like for next season. Currently 63 landowners have requested 62,000 trees. We can allocate up to 130,000 plants to landowners in the Moutere Catchment for the upcoming season. We also provide stakes and covers and where needed labour to assist with site preparation, planting and releasing plants. If you have riparian strips, wetlands, forestry stream setbacks or tree blocks that you want to plant from autumn 2021 please urgently answer the following survey to book in how many plants you want (https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/WJ5YCTP) or email annette.litherland@landcare.org.nz.

We also have funding for fencing riparian areas. Fencing is now underway by local fencing contractors on some properties and is booked in for others. We would like to get fencing complete before the planting season. We are still looking for more fences to build so if you have riparian areas that still need fencing off from stock please contact Elliot Easton ellioteaston@tet.org.nz

We had a great turnout of 57 people to hear Roger Dalrymple, chairman, of the Rangitikei River collective, talk about landowner led catchment groups. Notes from his talk will shortly feature on the Moutere catchment website.

TDC has contracted Tonkin and Taylor to carry out on the Fluvial Geomorphology Approaches (physical shape of the river, sediment flows and flooding) to River Management in the Moutere. The full report and a summary will be shortly available on our Moutere Catchment website.

A governance meeting will be held on 20 January.

We are hoping to host Jim Salinger to talk to us about likely climate change in the district on 13 February.

We will be running a healthy soil workshop in late April.

Our neighbouring Motueka River Collective has been running practical demonstrations of how to measure the water quality using the SHMK kits for landowners in subcatchments.

Denis ("Den") Gerish

The front page article of the June 1917 edition of The Grapevine was entitled A life on the Land. It told the story of Dennis ("Den") Gerrish, who was born in 1938, and who lived the first 74 years of his life in Kelling Road, before moving to Richmond with his wife, Joan. Den's recent death towards the end of 2020 is a personal loss for his family and friends, but it also represents the end of a treasure trove of memories of life on the land before the age of increased mechanisation, the internet and the subdivision of many farms in the district. I had the privilege of attending Den's funeral, and of learning more about him. For example, his voluntary community work, his patient tutoring of young farm cadets and his enthusiasm for introducing young people to tramping in the nearby mountains. A slide show showed the quintessential Den - gardening, tramping and sitting with his back against some wool bales with his dogs nearby. Other photos showed Den with his beloved family at various ages and stages of their lives.

It is fitting that Den was interred at Gardner Valley, a place that he had helped care for over a 20 year period.

Den will long be remembered in the Moutere and Neudorf areas as a man of integrity, kindness and a love of the land.

2021 SEASON

Hail has taken about 60 percent of our crops. But we still have the rest to pick!

We have a range of jobs available for active retirees and motivated youngsters, people who are keen to be a part of the harvest over a short period (this can also be a job share, ie couples).

<u>Hookers</u>, this requires the individual hop vine being hooked onto a feed system. You'll be in a team of two, each hooking up to 10 vines every minute. If the Hooker stops hooking, the Machine stops picking.

Shuttle Driver, vehicle driver pulling a large trailer, empty and full loads.

<u>Field Tractor Driver</u>, empty and full trailers in and out of the field. No road Running.

Bailing, this is an easy one, but some sturdy muscles required to use the Sack Barrow for moving completed bails.

<u>Tray Filler Observer</u>, you will watch the dryer trays being filled ensuring a nice even spread, it's a cake makers ultimate experience.

<u>Forklift Driver 1</u>, moving trailers and marshalling hookers. When the trailers are dropped to you, you'll position them for the hookers to ensure their continued work. Your communication skills with the Kiln Operator and Field is vital to ensure smooth running.

<u>Forklift Driver 2</u>, to move dried hops to bailing. This needs a delicate hand for deliberate, slow, precise driving.

<u>Kiln Dryer</u>, our electronic gadgets can tell you lots, but the Kiln Drier must be able to make good decisions and learn fast from mistakes. On the job training provided. If you can tell the difference between and slightly damp and a dry towel you maybe good for this!

<u>Picking Machine Operator</u>, to oversee the picking and cleaning process and adjust the machine for the best operational performance.






