Making waves

There's a local Moutere man making waves in the national water world! Not in the sports arena, but in the treatment and provision of safe, sustainable drinking water for New Zealand's communities.

Gary Smith is about as local as it gets - his family on both sides are long settled in the region and stretch back as far as the 1840s with some of his German ancestors. He grew up in Richmond, but it is here he made his home in 2008 after returning from overseas. Here also, set on a rise among sloping vineyards is the beating heart of Process Flow - a business dedicated to the delivery of water infrastructure services for both urban and rural customers. Gary and his highly skilled team design and build all manner of water treatment, storage and infrastructure, and are committed to protecting what we all know is our most valuable resource - water.

Gary initially trained as an electrical engineer in Wellington, where he lived and worked for seven years. This was followed by a fun filled season on the ski slopes in France, then a move to London – 'to pay for it'! He became involved in installing systems at the Heathrow Airport terminals - high voltage power, and building services. He returned to New Zealand in 2007 and the following year purchased his property in Hewetson Rd. Gary set about replacing the existing orchard with grapes, built a home and took up an opportunity to join a process engineering company.

As they say – the rest is history – Gary along with his previous business partner Tony Crosbie (another Upper Moutere local) set up a New Zealand branch then bought the company. At

the beginning they were involved in coal, gas and mining - providing solutions for mine run-off, processing plant and purifying water for discharge. Recognizing mining as a 'twilight' industry, and with increasing awareness of the need to lessen reliance on fossil fuels, Gary has since become sole owner and transitioned the company into providing municipal water infrastructure - 'It's more ethically sound, we know that good water is essential for good health, and the provision of safe and sustainable water can influence and enhance everyone's quality of life.' It's especially pertinent right now with the central government restructuring of 'Three Waters', and while Process Flow is mainly involved in drinking water, they are looking to move into the other two – stormwater and wastewater. Watch this space!

The company currently employs 6 full time staff (including Gary's sister, Vanessa) and several contractors, they like to employ locals where possible. No project is too large or too small, and with their focus on quality, and sustainability while remaining cost effective they are attracting attention from across the country. 

Poisonings

As we approach the cooler months, we often see an increase in pets being accidentally poisoned.

Rat bait

When the weather is cooler and wetter, rats and mice start migrating into buildings to seek warmth and store winter food. Many people will lay poisonous baits and unfortunately dogs (and sometimes cats) will eat them if they find them. Often dogs are poisoned when the rat bait box falls off a shelf in the garage. We urge you to use a proper bait station which is pet-proof and secure the storage area.

Most rat baits act by stopping blood from clotting, so the animal bleeds internally. Symptoms vary depending on where bleeding is occurring but they will always become lethargic and their gums will be pale or white – this may take several days. If you suspect your pet has eaten bait, it is important to bring them in ASAP to induce vomiting and/or start treatment with an antidote.

It is interesting to note that poisoning from eating rats and mice that have been poisoned is unusual as a large number have to be eaten to cause illness compared with direct ingestion of poison.



Two bio-dynamic workshops: further down the land

Funded by the Ke To Ora Trust, the Steiner School farm hosted its 6th biodynamic workshop last Saturday, to help the farm on its way to a sustainable approach to improving and healing the soil on land which had been used as a conventional pear orchard, heavily sprayed with chemicals, fertilizers, and insect repellents. The required paradigm shift to heal the soil and develop something new will take time and conscious effort from the community.

While five compost preparations and cow horns, which had been put together with Su Hoskins at the bio-dynamic workshop last month are now safely resting in the school garden soil over winter to collect what they need from cosmos and soil for the next spring season, the latest workshop provided a closer look at the relatively recent concept of soil conservation: food forests. It was led by Dieter Proebst who has actively lived with this approach on his own property and studied it in different places in the world Dieter is now sharing his knowledge with the next generation.

The workshop consisted of a theoretical introduction to the concept and practices of food forests and how they relate to bio-dynamic as well as permaculture principles.

In the afternoon the group moved on to the Riverside Community and met with John Clark. He gave us a tour through the food forest he established himself a few years ago to give us a clear picture of the processes he applied and the kinds of plants he used for his food forest, ranging from fruit and nut trees, tree lucerne, acacias and elderberries all of which were pruned regularly, sometime drastically, with the cuttings being used as mulch material. Nothing had gone to waste. The trees were providing a cover for smaller plants like a variety of berries but also shrubs, be that native or introduced plants. These plants then gave protection for perennial, as well as seasonal vegetables which densely covered the ground. The whole food forest was used as a catchment for water flow, which had in the past regularly overflown the whole area, causing erosion and damage. A long swathe had been dug to interrupt the flow of water and served as the bed for plants of different heights to grow together. Now the water flow was used by the plants as they needed it and did not overflow anymore.

The participants of the workshop were all impressed by the presence of the natural plants (even ones often considered to be weeds) which were companion plants, with the gardener helping to manage the growth in a way to always keep enough material for compost around the plants. Birds, worms, and other animal life were attracted to living in this environment, helping to keep the soil versatile and changing with the weather and adapting to seasonal changes.

The food forest approach left the participants with food for thought and there were suggestions of perhaps starting a group to grow their own food forests. Mutual support could be given and investments for some necessary tools, like a digger or chipper could be shared. It would also be beneficial to exchange experiences and learn together to observe the land





and learn to understand what soil and plants are telling of their needs.

Our human approach to the land stems from our widespread belief to consider land only as an economic commodity, which we can use for our own purposes, regardless of the damage this abuse has left nature to struggle with. We are losing touch with nature while living the way we are in our modern life. We need to reconnect with nature, learn together and from each other.


What I didn't know was that there are several verses of the Anthem in English, which I would like to share with you all here:


