It was love at first sight

When Fiona Bryan and her husband, Grant, first approached the Moutere Village, driving from Richmond, they knew they wanted this area to be their forever home. Somewhat surprising given that they both were born and bred in Auckland, true blue city folks! But they had decided on a lifestyle change, and a move to the South Island. Perhaps equally surprising - their first house was at the end of Deepdale Rd, by itself at the end of the 2.5km road, with décor of pigs heads and deer antlers, stark contrast to the city life, and they loved it.

There was a stint running the Moutere Hills Vineyard Café, delayed because it burnt down. Fiona worked for the owners for a year assisting with the rebuild, then she and Grant, who is a trained chef, managed it for a year—their children Jacob and Emily spent many hours watching movies in the pantry. Acknowledging that that was not the lifestyle they wanted their children to enjoy here they moved on. They relocated an art deco house from near Nelson College to a lovely, elevated site on Kelling Rd, modified it and turned it into their forever home, and now they cannot imagine ever leaving.



firefighter. She also became involved in community sports, joined committees, 'mother help', and coaching, including coaching 5 year old's cricket although she knew nothing about the game! She says her softball skills were handy, she could at least teach the children to throw! She also has hosted several international students - at the moment there are two, one from Norway and one from Germany. Son Jacob is now in Christchurch doing a

building apprenticeship and daughter Emily is in her final year of nursing and ironically is back working part time at the Moutere Hills Café – now called Forster's.

For the last fourteen years Fiona has worked for the Empowerment Trust New Zealand, and is now the executive director. The Trust runs programmes across the country targeted on keeping people safe and incudes all ages, from preschoolers to the elderly.

2022 has been a big year for Fiona and her husband. Grant suffers from a kidney disease and needed a transplant. Testing found Fiona to be compatible when other family members were not, so after 'zillions' of blood tests they underwent surgery in Wellington. They felt the full impact of Covid precautions, they were in separate rooms, could not see each other and could not have visitors. Fiona was in hospital for six days and Grant remained for two weeks, during which time they saw each other once. Four months on and she is nearly back to normal, and Grant is also recovering well. They are full of appreciation for the 'amazing' Wellington team and an excellent Nelson renal doctor.

Again, the Moutere community spirit has shown itself, with neighbours helping out with lawn mowing, baking and other assistance. And, in a tribute to women in general, (maybe tongue in cheek?) Grant says 'Now that I have a girl part I can multi-task!'

N.B. New Zealand currently has about 600 people waiting for a kidney transplant. If there is anyone thinking about becoming a donor Fiona recommends having a read of this or contacting your doctor to discuss further. Land and tree care at the **Steiner farm** school

The educational hub on the farm is being filled with different content. Two more workshops on biodynamic principles and practices are being offered now. The next one will elaborate on the concept of "Community Supported Agriculture" and might give some support on how to implement this concept on the farm land; the last workshop will review the benefit of bio-dynamic practices on September 3, and will end with a practical afternoon on grafting fruit trees. If you are interested, please register with Carolyn Hughes carolynhughes@foulis.nz and bring your own tools!

After these introductory workshops it will be up to the Steiner community and the Landcare Group to implement different aspects and keep the good intentions alive. For the Spring we will have to dig out the compost preparations we stored in the soil over the winter and see how they came out. They will have to be stored in a proper way so that they can keep for a longer time.

Now at the end of winter, tree care is still on the agenda with pruning the fruit trees in the school orchard, where the trees are pruned to a lower size so that the children can be involved in harvesting the fruit later on in the year. Last fall the fruit was being preserved in the outdoor kitchen.

Grass maintenance and control is always an important topic and concern because the farm has to rely on volunteer help to keep the fire hazard down. A team of committed volunteers share in the different tasks, but they are always grateful for new helpers.

There are regular working bees on tree care every other Wednesday after 3pm together with Tom (027 527 8200). Feel free to join.

Of course, there are still the grazing cows who contribute their share to keep the grass short! They have their own mind on how the grass, (or the ripe pears for that matter) should be managed! So, all in all we are learning





from each other, which is supporting the idea of an educational hub for the time being. There is still much room for exploration and serious work experiences.

Stomach ulcers in horses

Yes horses can get stomach ulcers too! Any horse can suffer from stomach ulcers but it is more common in horses performing at a high level such as showing, endurance and racing. The estimated prevalence is as high as 90% in endurance horses.

What are they? Stomach ulcers are painful sores that form in the stomach lining. The stomach of a horse is quite small considering the size of the animal. As a result horses need to be able to graze for long periods to take in their daily energy needs. At the same time the stomach is producing stomach acid 24 hours a day — up to 42 litres daily! When allowed to graze freely on hay and grass, the stomach acid is neutralised. However when grazing is restricted and horses are fed hard feed, the stomach is left for long periods with nothing to do. Exercise on top of excess stomach acid splashing around results in damage to the vulnerable stomach lining, bottom end of the throat and upper small intestine.

Other factors can also contribute to stomach ulceration such as stress from transporting, confinement, isolation, pain and medications.

Symptoms: Despite being painful many horses do not show any obvious outward signs. Often symptoms are subtle and could be due to many other causes. For example – poor appetite, weight loss, dull coat, reluctance to work or train, nervousness, girthiness, diarrhoea, colic. So ulcers are not just a stomach problem – they affect general health, well-being, behaviour and performance.

Diagnosis: The only definitive way to diagnose stomach ulcers is using an endoscope to look down inside the throat and stomach. It is also the only way to monitor response to treatment.

Treatment: Fewer than 10% of ulcers heal spontaneously. Almost all horses diagnosed with ulcers require medical treatment for weeks to months as well as long term management of their environment to minimise recurrence.



Correlations and filters



Warning: this article contains speculation, simplification, and overgeneralization. I think we should keep this kind of warning in mind whenever encountering big claims. What follows are related ideas that have been joined together as if one explains the other. I think they might, this does not mean they do.

In his 2008 article 'Patternicity', Michael Shermer builds on the concept of our brains being a patternrecognition machine, looking for causes of events. Noticing patterns making predictions, in increasing the likelihood of survival and reproduction. Up until recent history, survival was dependent on reacting quickly to new information. Before modern times, jumping to a conclusion may have been more beneficial than slowing down and coming to the right conclusion. Believing a movement in the grass is a predator when it is probably the wind is better for survival than dismissing it as the wind, if there is a chance of it being a predator.

When looking for causes of events we sometimes find what looks like patterns in meaningless noise. In statistics this is called a type 1 error; mistakenly thinking that we have found something that is not there. A type 2 error is the opposite, missing something which is there. When the cost of a type 1 error is less than the cost of a type 2 error, then natural selection will favour type 1 errors. We may tend to be wrong more often to increase the chance of being right sometimes.

The threats and big problems that we face today are not like a rustle in the grass. We have gone from an environmentwhere very small amounts of information could be of life and death importance, to an environment where unlimited information is mostly of little importance.

Since the invention of the printing press there has been an expanding pool of information to draw correlations from. With modern online publishing we are inundated with people making every kind of causal claim. Mostly these people are making type 1 errors. I use an analogy of a water filter; if a filter is too fine the flow is overly restrictive and blocks easily, If the filter is too coarse it will let through excessive contaminates. Choosing the right filter depends on the water source and the intended use of the water.

Like choosing the right filter for the job, information used for important decisions, or coming from suspect sources needs to be scrutinized more carefully. Please remember, almost no information comes with a suitable warning of speculation, simplification, and over-generalization; perhaps more should.
