A Simple Philosophy

Whaia Te iti Kahurangi Ki te tūohu koe Me he maunga teitei

'Be persistent in your seeking of what is truly important to you and your well -being. Do not let obstacles stop you achieving this'

Bruce and Betty Eggers share this simple philosophy of life, based on an old Māori proverb that's been handed down from Betty's ancestors, through generations.

They met in the Moutere pub in 1968, he a local lad and she a nurse from the Eastern Bay of Plenty on her first OE – across the Cook Strait! Fifty-four years later they still reckon the old proverb pretty much 'sums it up'.

Betty was born into a dairy farming family in Opōtiki, an area with a predominantly Māori population. They spoke Māori, tikanga, and their life revolved around the local marae and all things Māori - parenting, provision of food, whānau. She is one of seven


Grapevine Says..

siblings, but recalls always having extra foster kids, whom they regarded as brothers and sisters – 'a revolving family', and their everyday lives were all about whānau. The children were all very dedicated to school, and even when the roads were flooded, they would ride a horse, a rope halter, with up to 3 kids on a sack on its back or hitch a ride on a tractor rather than miss a day. They loved their sports, which included bullrush, hula-hoop, skipping, double dutch and knucklebones.

She recalls great years at Ōpōtiki High – the young people often gathered at the local hall to dance and jive or go to movies. Interestingly she says there was a lot of trust between parents and young people, and the majority of families didn't drink, alcohol was not a part of her immediate whanau. Betty's teenage years were memorable and fun, albeit somewhat 'sheltered.'

She had always liked nursing, and was initially drawn to theatre work, but fainted during her first experience! She trained at the local hospital but had her own ideas about the future and knew she didn't want to remain in Optitiki. So, she and two friends took a break, and planned their OE – to the South Island - to embolden them for heading to Fiji. They wanted something different and to go and see the world. They came to the Moutere as part of a Labour Department work scheme, to work on a tobacco farm in

Thorpe. When the three girls walked into the Moutere pub one night, Bruce Eggers noticed Betty, he went over for a chat and as they say the rest is history......(although Betty hasn't made it to Fiji yet)

Bruce had grown up in the Moutere, his father was a farmer, but Bruce also spent time on the West Coast logging with some of his uncles. At that point he saw his future in logging, not farming, but when his father suffered a stroke he borrowed the money and bought the farm. He and Betty married in 1970 and some tough years ensued. They worked hard and purchased more land, took risks, and welcomed three children. A busy life, but Bruce and Betty shared a vision and after about ten years things improved, and theirs became the largest hop farm in Nelson. They took their first overseas trip together in 1979 to Australia.

Betty found support from the local women, a close-knit valley group and joined the rural womens group, and was of course involved with school stuff, and they supported the fire brigade and the rugby club. In the early 1990's they bought a pig hunting block in the Owen River, which took Bruce back to his love of logging. Over the years they've dabbled in stock farming, berries, orcharding, before selling the bulk of the farm, and building a forever home on a hill overlooking their remaining property.

Bruce is still involved with cattle and

forestry and has undertaken a major landscaping project at home, mainly natives, although Betty said she sneaks in some exotics from time to time. Betty still likes to go home to the East Cape and Opōtiki to visit her whānau, but it's not long before she is homesick and wants to come back! She regularly looks after her grandchildren, and helps out at the Kai Collective, a local initiative for providing baking and meals to those who need them, and is involved with the Moutere Gold Te Reo group, who meet once a week. Betty offers support and helps with practicing everyday conversation - and who better?

And while, as she says, life may not always be an easy road, her advice is to make the best of it and carry on, take whatever comes, one day at a time. And remember the old Maori proverb







Lumps and bumps

We quite often discover lumps on our animals, especially as they get older. Some lumps are temporary such as abscesses and enlarged glands. But some lumps are permanent and may remain the same or may change over time. Any of these permanent lumps are considered to be tumours but not all of them need to cause concern. A benign tumour tends to grow slowly by pushing other types of cells out of the way and doesn't damage other parts of the body. Malignant tumours are the ones we worry about as they can invade nearby organs and spread to other parts of the body. Malignant tumours are what we refer to as cancer.

Sometimes we can identify a lump just by looking at it but, if not, the first step is to do a simple needle biopsy. This gives us a sample of cells which we identify under the microscope. We can usually tell which sort of cells they are and whether they are cancerous. So this helps us decide whether it's necessary to surgically remove the lump or not. A lump should definitely be checked out if:

- It is growing rapidly
- It suddenly gets bigger after being the same size for a long time
- It goes up and down in size
- It changes in appearance e.g. was smooth but is now knobbly, or was soft and is now hard
- It starts to bleed or annoy the animal.

We sometimes surgically remove benign tumours too. The main reasons would be if the tumour is in an awkward place such as on an eyelid, in the 'armpit', under a collar, or it's getting knocked about by the animal.

If we do decide to remove a lump for whatever reason, early is better. A smaller lump means shorter surgery, less expense and less pain for your animal.



NB Animals with arthritis almost never whimper, whine or complain about being in pain, so don't rely on this as a symptom. If your pet is limping, it is usually due to pain. There is no cure but arthritic pain and inflammation can be minimised by managing your pet's weight, exercise and treatment.

If you have a pet that's struggling on its legs, bring them in for a checkup and we can help you help them to have an enjoyable, pain-free life.
