thanks to time he'd already spent (since the age of 14) working for a local caterer and went on to work full time as a chef at the Mapua Wharf - 'a great experience'.

To stay connected with mates while working, Andy joined a discipleship group where young people could ask questions and have discussions about 'everything' related to life and faith. Through this group came an opportunity to attend a personal development course in Australia, which in turn led to a two-year internship at a Church on the Gold Coast, which included study as well as a chaplaincy role - and a chance for Andy to hone his surfing

Back in NZ he ran the local youth group while the then leader, took a sixmonth sabbatical that turned out to be permanent - so Andy shelved plans to return to Australia and stayed on as leader for six and a half years. He also met and married Janine Heine and decided to train as a primary teacher. He'd been involved with school through the youth work, so it made sense and offered better security. It wasn't always easy juggling the study, youth work and a young family, but he gained his degree and went on to teach at Motueka South School for ten years. In the absence of a dedicated pastor at the Lutheran Church, Andy undertook many roles, prepared messages, helped out with music and general oversight. He still had no aspirations to be a pastor, and wife Janine certainly wasn't happy with the connotations of being 'pastors' wife' - even though her great great great grandfather had himself been the pastor there. She is an early childhood educator and is currently studying for a master's degree.

But fate or destiny (or God) had a

plan, and during the process of finding someone who would be a good fit, and with a lot of community encouragement Andy realized it could be him and that perhaps he was being a Jonah by trying to avoid it? The Church had at first been looking for a more traditionally trained person, but a special dispensation was made, and Andy was able to fill the role. As he says, "the important thing is that people hear the good news in what you are saying and doing and anyone coming to church should leave feeling unburdened". The church has been part of the community for 175 years and he hopes that will continue and be a place where everyone is welcome.

He has been the full-time pastor since 2018, and it's been a very interesting and challenging four years. Lockdowns, vaccines, zoom church, and even a dramatic burglary, which included an

> interview on National Radio and a personal apology by the burglar in front of the whole congregation, who was of course forgiven!

Andy is also well known in local rugby circles, he played with the Rangers for about twelve years and is now involved with coaching rugby and touch. He has aspirations of one day playing rugby with his sons.

And his one regret since becoming pastor is that he doesn't spend as much time at the pub as he'd planned to!







# Earth care - a different approach

The Steiner Farm offered a workshop on making compost preparations last autumn as one of eight workshops on bio-dynamic principles funded by the Keteora Trust. 56 cow horns from bio-dynamic farms were filled with fresh cow manure, sealed with clay and buried in the Steiner school garden.

We were curious to check what had happened in these horns during the winter, this being the first time we had undergone this process on the Steiner Farm, so, recently, we opened up the hole – and yessssss! There were the horns! We carefully tapped each one and the manure came out, perfectly dried and shaped like the horn it had been filled into, in the consistency of potting soil.

We emptied all the horns and stored the dry substance, now called "preparation 500" or "horn manure", in a sealed clay pot to be stored with one of our group members, who will give out a suitable amount, weighed according to the size of the land to be covered; (a handful of preps to 15 l of lukewarm water for ca. 12 ha of land, stirred by hand for an hour, then spread by hand with a brush). The preps can also be ordered directly by the BD Association, address

see below). Spreading prep 500 has been carried out on the old pear orchard for a number of years and will now happen twice a year with our own preparations.

We want to turn this practice into a little research project together with the local high school and/or other interested people in the community: we will do regular soil testing twice a year to see whether there are any observable changes in the soil consistency in comparison with conventional chemical fertilizer, and also to observe plant growth over the year. This could turn into an ongoing project raising awareness in student's understanding of sustainability and bio-dynamic practices,

as well as Māori understandings of earth healing.

The idea behind this practice is that the earth is not sleeping over the winter, but is



very much alive and active, striving in its connections with the moon and the stars. This activity transforms the cow manure and turns it into a vital substance with homeopathic healing qualities for the earth.

Other preparations were also put into the school ground during the workshop in April, involving animal organs and specific plants, used for different purposes. Further reports will follow.

### Fireworks recap...


Some animals are not bothered by fireworks but others can be extremely stressed. If you have a pet that's freaked out by fireworks, it is more effective to prevent (or at least reduce) their exposure to noise and lights than trying to calm them when they are panicking. Move your pet into a familiar room and close curtains before sunset. Then play music or turn on the TV before fireworks start. Having another pet in the room that isn't fearful can help a scared pet relax. And if possible, it is better to remain relaxed and matter-of-fact yourself rather than stressing about your pet's behaviour and behaving anxiously.

If you plan ahead, Adaptil and Feliway are very helpful for reducing stress but have to be started at least a week or two before they're needed. Rescue Remedy, Calmex and similar remedies may also help when started ahead of time. Thundershirts are effective for many pets. Sometimes we prescribe medication to help calm pets - this requires a checkup in the clinic and should also be done ahead of

Sometimes we do Faecal Egg Counts to determine parasite numbers and whether you need to drench. And we can also diagnose the parasite species present so you drench with the most effective product.



# Rational Confidence or Dogmatic Certainty?

Many struggle to distinguish rational confidence and dogmatic certainty. We tend to rely on subjective cues ('Does this claim feel reasonable?') rather than objective standards ('Does the claim really meet shared criteria?'). Without shared standards, our thinking becomes ingrown and self-validating. The failure to understand reason's requirements fuels delusion, polarization, and ideological rigidity.

Fortunately, scientists have arrived at a reasonably objective standard. More precisely, we better understand how rational people update their beliefs in the face of evidence. This article is meant to communicate a working understanding of rational belief revision. It also flags common pitfalls of thought.

### What Rational Confidence Looks Like




The diagram above represents the degree of confidence (C) A rational person will have in a belief (B) given awareness of evidence (E). In this case, a greater amount of evidence for (represented by three down- arrows) outweighs a single consideration against (the up-arrow). Together, they support a rational level of confidence in a belief.

Downward pressure on one end of a lever can support a weighty object at the other end.

The lever pivots on "reason's fulcrum" (R), which is the willingness to change one's mind in the face of evidence.\* Here, the lever is horizontal, the load is balanced, and the system as a whole is in equilibrium. Philosophers call this reflective equilibrium.

Being rational is basically a matter of maintaining reflective equilibrium. Usually, this means nudging the fulcrum to the left or the right to accommodate new evidence and keep the system balanced. The length of the lever's right arm is the degree of confidence a rational person will place in belief, given the evidence. Simply put, reasonable people proportion their confidence to the evidence. As evidence for a belief accumulates, the fulcrum should shift to the left, increasing confidence. Evidence against should shift it to the right, reducing confidence.

### What Dogmatic Certainty Looks Like



This second diagram represents the thinking of a dogmatic believer. Here, a need for certainty has shifted the fulcrum all the way to the left, leaving evidence no room to change the person's mind. This is how certainty damages minds: it turns what should be a lever into a mere ramp. Imagine trying to dislodge a tree stump with a lever. In this case, deep roots (here representing emotional attachment to a belief) can prevent you from reaching reflective equilibrium.

Imagine the weight of evidence doing nothing to budge a cherished belief and instead damaging the lever or fulcrum: just so can dogmatic beliefs unhinge reason. (Psychologists call this "motivated reasoning" and stress that one form of it—"identity- protective cognition"—can fatally compromise your rationality.)

A truly rational person doesn't cling to beliefs and ideas. They forswear wilful believing and commit to evidence-based believing. They seek understanding, avoid certainty, stay humble, and strive for reflective equilibrium. Only so can a mind remain open and flexible.
