Passing the torch

Mike Teece has had his Red Bands firmly planted on Upper Moutere clay for as long as he can remember.

He grew up on his father's farm, and from an early age had a love for stock and tractor work. His early memories include telling his father to cultivate new paddocks so he could spend more time on the tractor, which he learnt to drive at the age of 6 or 7, and skipping school to help with lambing because his father's hands were too big for the job.

Mike never liked school, left as soon as he was fifteen, and after a stint working on a farm in Marlborough and another in Masterton, he set off to see the world. At first it was Australia, working in the mines and railways, then a year in Asia - which Mike reckons taught him more than all his years of school - and then on to Europe and England.

In 1981, after seven years abroad he headed home for a holiday to find that his father had had enough of farming and wanted to retire. Tradition meant that his older brother was offered the farm first, but he declined, and Mike was next. At first reluctant - he still had itchy feet - but his love of farming won and in spite of some trepidation about borrowing the money he decided to go

for it. He got married the same year and set about changing farming practices to increase viability to service his mortgage. There was a near disastrous foray into growing green tea, it turned out that climatic conditions and the high UV level did not suit the crop, so he went into apples and blackcurrants, along with running sheep and cattle.

Along with the busy farm and family life – Mike and his wife had three children – Mike played rugby until he was fifty, assisted with community events and spent ten years in the Fire Brigade. Over the years they travelled some more, to Australia and further afield, sometimes with the children, sometimes without.

The farm property itself has been in the family for some 130 years, so the roots go deep. It was originally purchased by Mike's great grandfather Charles in the 1880's, and passed down through the generations, to grandfather Fred and father Tom, before Mike. The family still have an old leather-bound ledger book which dates back to 1888 and contains handwritten records of trading deals – for example salt for sheep-

skins – and it is a fascinating historical record. The original trading post was a two-storey shed on the farm, which sadly burnt down in 1990, one year before a planned centennial celebration. The size of the landholding has reduced over the years, and the original homestead was rebuilt in 1968, as it was more economic than re-piling and re-roofing the old house. Interestingly the new dwelling cost \$14,000 for 250 square metres!

Mike thought he would never leave Upper Moutere, until a spur of the moment decision about eighteen months ago saw him purchase a beachfront house in Parapara, and the transplant process began! He and his partner Rachel now live in Golden Bay permanently, and in a continuation of the family tradition he has just sold the Upper Moutere farm property to son Nathan and his partner Lenya. They live there and plan to use it as a base for their wider farming operation – a fifth generation of Teeces in Wills Rd! Nathan and Lenya have two young sons, who also love farming so it may continue for many years yet....

These days Mike spends his time walking, talking, biking, playing badminton, and fishing – in the past he's enjoyed fishing and is loving the freedom of owning his own boat, albeit a learning curve! He's becoming more involved in the Golden Bay community thanks to being part of the Lions and other groups.

And the Red Bands are covered in sand, or he's likely barefoot in true Golden Bay style!

Vet Helpline

Do you have a skinny old cat?

If you answered 'yes' then read on....

Many of our cats look thinner as they get older. This can be just the normal aging process where muscle mass is lost due to being less active (just like people). But if your cat is looking skinnier and skinnier, that's not normal!

There are several common diseases that occur in older cats resulting in weight loss. These are:

- Hyperthyroidism
 (= over-active thyroid gland)
- Kidney disease
- Diabetes

These diseases can be managed and enable our pets to live a good quality life. But left untreated, older cats have a poor quality of life and are likely to be euthanased earlier.

They can all be diagnosed quickly and easily with a blood test. And treatment can be as simple as popping a tablet into your pet's dinner. Some cases are more complicated however and require further tests and checkups along the way to keep your elderly cat well.

Unfortunately there are a lot of other diseases which cause cats to lose weight. Some can be treated with medicines or surgically, and others are untreatable. But it is much better for your pet to have a checkup and have the appropriate care and advice to give your pet the best quality of life for as long as they have left.



Just like human doctors, vets are being increasingly careful about antibiotic use to slow the development of antibiotic resistance. This is when bacteria become resistant to antibiotics so the antibiotic becomes useless. Antibiotic resistance is a problem for everyone as it is a threat to successful treatment of infections in all species including

humans. To protect our currently effective antibiotics we need to use them less frequently and only if really necessary alongside other strategies such as thoroughly cleaning wounds and preventing disease in the first place e.g. by vaccination. Nowadays there will be cases where we no longer prescribe antibiotics when in the past we did and there are several antibiotic groups that we can only use as a last resort and only after specific bacterial testing. Also if your pet (or you!) is prescribed antibiotics always make sure you give the whole course even if they seem better before it is finished – don't stop early and don't save any for another time!
