Werner and Karen Bagen

Cram, cram, cram, cram, every chink and cranny

Recently, whilst out walking in Blackbird Valley, we discovered a roadside stall selling, amongst other things, avocados and some unusual trees. Intrigued, we made contact with Werner and Karen Bagen - who kindly showed us around their amazing garden, which includes a huge number of lesser known trees and over 20 varieties of scented geraniums. The garden is an inspiring example of what can be done on a 2,500sqm piece of land. Below is an account of the development of their section and of living in harmony with the environment.

We came from Blenheim 23 years ago looking for a small rural holding, where we could grow enough fruit and vegetables to become as self-sufficient as possible and to have a more balanced lifestyle. It took us nine months and a

lot of searching to find this property.

Our terraced garden is around 2,500 sqm and is functional and experimental rather than formally landscaped. We have around 70 trees, glasshouses, raised vegetable beds, berry cages and a scattering of herb and flower beds. Vita Sackville-West's approach to her famous garden at Sissinghurst, Kent, England was to "cram, cram, cram, every chink and cranny..." and that is certainly part of our garden philosophy. Some of the more uncommon plants that we grow are as follows:

Worcester Berries (a cross between a blackcurrant & gooseberry) Monarch Gooseberry (red) Tayberry (a cross between a blackberry & Damp; raspberry)

We try to limit our use of non-organic sprays and mainly use natural materials, including seaweed, comfrey and fish to feed our plants. We make our own compost and supplement our needs with Goldpine compost utilising their self-drive truck. Nothing is wasted from the garden: Karen freezes surplus vegetables and fruit, and makes chutney and jams.

We dabble occasionally in markets, mainly in the top of the south area, including the Ngatimoti Festival, Wakefield Fete and Garden Marlborough, where we sell plants (many grown from cuttings or seeds), any surplus produce we may have and garden art, in particular driftwood art, handcrafted by Werner. Customers appreciate our wide range of plants, especially the more unusual ones.

Our underlying motivation is to en-

courage other people to grow their own produce and thus benefit from the health-giving properties inherent in gardening (it is also interesting to note that, for his health, Werner daily imbibes a seaweed concoction!). We would love to see the Moutere emerge as a main cultural and gourmet hub for the Nelson region. There are so many local artisans and a huge variety of crops already being grown here. Werner and Karen concluded by saying, "we just want to add our little bit to enhance the flavour of the area."







What are the common clauses in an S&P agreement?

Whether it's your first time, or your 10th time, your first step is knowledge...



You've found a property that you are keen on putting an offer on....so what is the process? The real estate salesperson can prepare a S&P Agreement for you, (or if you'd prefer your solicitor can do this too). Some of the common clauses / conditions in an Agreement are:

Solicitors Approval — usually inserted for both the purchaser and vendor — this gives the solicitor the opportunity to review the form and content of the agreement (for the vendor) and the form, content, Title for the purchaser. We always advise you to seek solicitor advise when putting in an offer.

Finance and Insurance – if you have the full amount of money in the bank you shouldn't need this clause, but if you are getting approval from

the bank / broker, you should always have this clause in your offer – lenders usually pre-approve lending to a certain level – but not the property and will still want to see a S&P agreement. Risk here is if you are reliant on a mortgage and don't include this clause, and you go unconditional, and then the bank declines your lending, you are contractually obliged to purchase the property. For insurance, phone your provider and check they will insure the property on settlement.

Builders report – A building inspection, by a qualified building inspector, provides an expert assessment of the buildings condition and identifies any potential problems with the weathertightness, structural integrity or habitability of the property. It can also identify ongoing maintenance requirements.

LIM report – this is a Land Information Memorandum report, prepared by your local authority – i.e. TDC or NCC and providers relevant historic and current information about the property and site, such as zoning, consents, rates, restrictions, hazards, services etc.





Arthritis - a new way of treating

Arthritis is a condition that leads to pain and progressive degeneration of a joint. Painful joints and limited mobility will reduce quality of life - often the symptoms are mistaken for getting old and slowing down but many older pets that are slow to get up or down, or lag behind on walks are feeling the effects of arthritis. Pets rarely whimper, whine or complain about arthritic pain - they often just do less - dogs will watch you go to the washing line rather than go with you and cats will stop jumping up to the windowsill or change behaviours such as start pooing outside the litter tray or stop grooming.

What can I do to help? There is no cure for arthritis but the good news is we can do a lot to make our pets comfy by reducing inflammation and pain — by managing weight, exercise and treatment.

Treatment - Recently a new therapy for arthritis has become available - Beransa for dogs and Solensia for cats. These are monthly injections of monoclonal antibodies which target and neutralise a protein involved in causing arthritic pain. So it's a biological therapy that works like your pet's own immune system. We have been seeing good results with these products in our clinics. There are many other treatment options and arthritis is best managed with several rather than relying on one! A

warm, comfy, well-padded bed away from draughts can make a huge difference. Massage, physiotherapy, acupuncture, good nutrition such as Hills j/d, nutraceuticals such as 4cyte and Grand Flex are all helpful. And of course, we can give anti-inflammatory medication and pain relief – these can transform a pet's life.

Weight control – one of the most important things you can do for an arthritic animal is maintain their optimum weight. Extra kilograms are just more load on struggling joints. There are several combined weight loss/mobility diets available to help with this.

Exercise management —Short, frequent walks on flat, soft ground will help maintain muscle mass and strength without high impact on joints. Swimming is great if it's not too cold!

Lamb Vaccinations

Just a quick reminder about providing your ewes and lambs with the best protection against clostridial diseases. Best practice is to vaccinate your ewes 2-4 weeks pre-lambing. The pre-lamb



booster will trigger production of antibodies in the ewes' colostrum which the new born lambs are able to absorb when they begin suckling. These antibodies give passive protection for up to 12 weeks. Unvaccinated ewes will not pass this protection on to their lambs, so the lambs are at a greater risk of Tetanus and pulpy kidney. If this is the case; lambs will need to be vaccinated using Lamb Vaccine to give immediate short term passive protection against Tetanus. This protection will last for 2-3 weeks and is recommended to be given at tailing. Lambs should begin their vaccination programme well before the colostrum protection ends. The administration of Ultravac® 5in1 or Ultravac 5+1 B12 vaccine at 4-6 weeks, with a booster at 8-10 weeks will minimise the risk of losing lambs once the antibodies run out. Completing the initial vaccination course of two injections before or around weaning is essential as most lambs become susceptible to pulpy kidney at this time.
