BACK TO LIFE



he Hewetson family has farmed in the Moutere for over 150 years, building a simple farmworkers' cottage on the Moutere Highway back in 1863. Early records tell of the Hewetsons rescuing their sheep when a labrador pup, which had escaped from the local missionary's house, tried to round them up.

When Shane and Lee-Ann Kemp moved into the house in 1999, it was again the Hewetsons who helped out when one of the couple's huskies escaped into the neighbouring field and chased the sheep. By this time, though, the farmworkers' cottage was a shadow of its former self. Walter, the last of the Hewetson family to live there, had died in the late Eighties, and cows had been left to roam the dilapidated property.

Fortunately, the homestead was later granted a Historic Places Trust category C rating and spared from impending demolition by Darryn and Sabina Neuland, who set about saving the old lady. Two more owners in short succession also did their bit but, for one reason or another, moved on. Enter Shane and Lee-Ann, who brought fresh enthusiasm to the project. Even they underestimated the time and money needed to restore the house. "None of us foresaw that the builders would be virtually living with us for over a year," says Lee-Ann. "We were told we were lucky it was still standing. One shake and it would have fallen to pieces!"

Their two children, Jackson (13) and Danni (eight), have grown up with the project and Lee-Ann reckons it's toughened them up in the process. "When we moved, there was no insulation under the house and it was so cold in winter that a cup of coffee left on the bench would be frozen in the morning. The only other insulation was turn-of-the-century gospel newspapers. As a baby, Jackson was carried around to the warmest spot in an antique basket, and slept in front of the fire. I only took them away for one week of the project when the roof came off and Danni came to me soaking wet, saying there was a waterfall in the room."

Lee-Ann Kemp's vision.

Since those early days, the Kemps have installed insulation, replaced windows and put in a new fireplace, plus a heat pump to warm the 1926 concrete extension at the back, which was originally added as an ablution block and pantry. On removing the old fireplace, they found blackened timbers behind the walls.

"It's lucky the house hadn't gone up in flames."

Working alongside architectural designer Leigh Briars, and starting in the attic space, Glenn Grant and his building team of Patrick Ryan and Glen Chamberlain began bringing the house up to code. "We wanted to keep as much of the original property as we could, but turn it into a warm, bright and comfortable home," says Lee-Ann, explaining how this space has become three lightfilled bedrooms and a large bathroom by adding four new gables.

Rotted joists and beams cut from tree branches have been replaced, and the native timber floorboards matched as closely as possible throughout. Sanding companies "ran screaming" at the sight of the thick, dark varnish coating the hallway and staircase, leaving Shane with no option but to tackle it himself.

Steve at Motueka Joinery did a great job creating old-style window frames and a fireplace surround. The concrete 'bunker' has become a sunny kitchen diner adjoining the living room, with a spare bedroom and lounge at the front of the house. A black fountain, found by Lee-Ann's parents, creates a striking centerpiece in the front garden, while raised vegetable beds, a swimming pool and covered verandah add to the relaxed ambience at the back.

The project almost complete, the Kemps have thrown themselves headlong into new ventures – Shane bringing in bikes, cars, jet skis and other luxury items from the States. Lee-Ann, meanwhile has set up her Danni K furniture business, selling unusual contemporary items. Watch this space for an online shop and showroom located near their house. www.danniks.co.nz

Just how dry will this next summer be?

An Update on Water Supply in the Moutere Hills Area

Since the public meeting organised by the MHRA in April we have spent some time piecing together the factors affecting the provision of a potable water supply for the residents of the Dovedale and Upper Moutere area.

This included meeting with a representative of TDC engineering department and with the chair of the present Dovedale Water Committee, and collecting information from the TDC website.

Water supply on the Dovedale scheme has become somewhat more reliable as faulty sections have been replaced, but the water quality remains below standard and worsens over summer as intake reduces and water is taken from a lower outlet. A permanent "boil water notice" continues to be in place. TDC has not yet produced a required Public Health Risk Management Plan for the scheme and says this "will be reviewed as part of the 2015-2025 Long Term Plan". The volume available from the present source cannot be increased, and the scheme is seen as slowly amassing more debt.

Plans exist at TDC for supplying water to the Dovedale scheme from a new source in the Motueka river gravels near Woodstock to improve both quality and available quantity. However, any such plans have been postponed by TDC with a new "placeholder" date of 2026. There is no certainty of this date being any more reliable than the previously announced 2016 date. TDC claim that the \$1.6 million dollars estimated to get a new source and treatment station and fix the supply pipes was seen as too high a price to be carried by the people serviced by the present scheme.

One of the problems preventing us moving forward is that focus has been on the existing Dovedale Scheme rather than on actual number of households (potential users) in the distribution area. The survey on the next page is part of our effort to establish a better view of the demand in the distribution area.

Meanwhile, TDC is running a public consultation on the proposed Waimea Dam - to supply Richmond and the Waimea Plains with more water. Go to our website to read more about the proposal and implications. The cost of building this dam - if it is ever built - would affect ratepayers in the whole district, but there are no plans to get any of the water from the dam to the Moutere Hills!

Possible avenues for improving the supply situation include:

- 1. Pressure TDC to construct the suggested new bore and treatment station for the existing scheme and make it available to more of the population.
- 2. Create a new wholly independent water supply scheme using an existing bore at Pangatotora in the Motueka River gravels. This scheme would be community-owned and would aim to operate at rates competitive to those of the Dovedale scheme. It could take over the connections of the Dovedale scheme in the Moutere catchment, freeing up capacity on the remainder of Dovedale scheme at the same time. Any new scheme would be required to supply pristine quality water from day one. However, this can only work with buy-in of the majority of the community.
- 3. Reduce the basic unit of supply on the Dovedale scheme from 2m³ to 1-1.5 m³. This might allow additional houses to be serviced, but would not improve the quality of the available water.
- 4. Request TDC to service the Moutere catchment from Mapua with water coming from the to-be-constructed Waimea Dam if it is ever built.







Hello Animal Lovers.

I have written before about the importance of communication when working with animals but I believe it is worth repeating.

It is an undisputed fact that if an owner understands how to communicate with their animal and applies it consistently, there will be a wonderful partnership based on mutual trust.

As humans we rely on speech to communicate as we can express ourselves sometimes very well with one another but just imagine you go to a foreign country where you do not understand their language and they don't understand yours and you will approximate how it is for our animals. So many owners know this but insist on talking to their pets as though they were a person. What animals do understand is tone and body language. Using word associations with certain actions and then reward is a successful way to train your pet. However if the owner gets upset or angry through frustration and communicates that to their pet, it only serves to put that animal in a fear response. In horses it can be running away or if contained, biting and kicking. In dogs it can be a biting response or dependent on the dog, can also be total submission by rolling over or cowering. Cats will turn and fight or run if possible depending on the threat. Even birds will peck or can be aggressive. All animals have a way of dealing with fear, it is a basic instinct and the trick is to keep them calm and quiet. It is of course easier said than done and us humans cannot be calm and quiet all the time. However if one is working or living with animals we should certainly try to be consistent and if we are really feeling upset or angry should not take it out on our beloved animals.

What amazes me is how forgiving our animals are with us. Even animals that have had some very bad handling and training can respond to kindness and consistency. Currently there is a program on TV1 on Mondays at 7.30pm called Purina Pups. It demonstrates how dogs that have been abandoned as too aggressive to be handled and put in the pound usually have to be put down as not suitable to be rehomed. Luckily an animal behaviourist rescues some of them and then sets about to gain their trust and give them a happy and purposeful life. It is wonderful through the medium of television that it will reach so many people who hopefully will get the message. Each year too many animals are put down due to the bad handling they have received from their owners.

So all animal owners should try to communicate with their pet as effectively as possible or if in doubt gain expert advice from a trusted vet or animal behaviourist. If we communicate with our animals it is not only more desirable but a lot safer as well. We have our pets for many years and by having effective communication can become loving and respectful companions.

IMPROVING FLOCK PERFORMANCE BY **AVOIDING ABORTION LOSSES**

You can't control many aspects of farming, like the weather and the lamb schedule, but you can certainly avoid the devastating effects of abortion storms and losses. By taking control of your flock's performance and vaccinating for two of the most common causes of sheep abortion, toxoplasma and campylobacter, you reduce the risk of these diseases impacting on your lamb numbers.

Toxoplasma and Campylobacter cause disease throughout the country. Nationwide blood testing shows that these diseases are present on 100% and 88% of farms in New Zealand respectively.

Every breeding flock can be affected by ongoing, insidious losses and abortion storms. Ewe hoggets and two tooths are most at risk, but any ewe that contracts Toxoplasmosis for the first time while she is pregnant is likely to lose her lamb/s. Toxoplasmosis can cost you in three ways:

- The loss of lambs by abortion; either by low-level unseen losses, or large-scale abortion storms
- The birth of weak lambs which fail to thrive or die.
- The culling of fertile ewes, which because of undetected early abortion are presumed barren.

Toxovax® is a single dose vaccine that provides breeding ewes with lifetime protection against the effects of Toxoplasmosis. Vaccination with Toxovax increases lambing percentage by an average of 3% and decreases the incidence of dry ewes by an average of 14%.

As Toxovax is a live vaccine with a short shelf-life, it must be made to order. To ensure availability for your needs, it is imperative you order your requirements at least eight weeks in advance of putting the ram in. This will allow you to give Toxovax to 1st time breeding ewes at least four weeks before mating. Toxovax can also be given any time prior to this.

Campylobacter is the other major cause of sheep abortion. In fact, when the cause of an abortion is identified, Campylobacter is likely to be found as frequently as Toxoplasma, which makes sense given it is present on most farms. It is therefore likely to be present on your farm even though it may not have been diagnosed or you have not seen abortions. It can be responsible for large scale abortions, with losses of 20-30% common, but losses of 70% have been reported. There is also strong evidence to suggest that infection with Campylobacter also plays a role in reduced lamb survival. Numerous studies have shown an association between vaccinations and increased lambing percentage - even when no abortions have been seen, vaccination has been observed to increase lambing percentage by an average of 9%.

Most Campylobacter abortions in sheep are caused by the species Campylobacter fetus. Testing indicates that around half of all ewes are exposed to C. fetus during their lifetime. A second species, C. jejuni can also cause abortion and can be significant, but is more sporadic.

A sensitiser and booster vaccination of Campyvax4®, 4-8 weeks apart into all replacement and 1st time breeding ewes is recommended. An annual booster in following years is also recommended. Vaccination timing can fit normal farming practice but best practice is to try and get both doses done prior to mating.

To make things easier for you, Campyvax4 can be ordered from-Campyvax4 provides your ewes protection against all C. fetus strains and is the only vaccine that includes C. jejuni. Vaccination will protect against both Campylobacter abortion storms and unseen losses between scanning and tailing.

NOT JUST A MASHED POTATO!

Here are a couple of recipes that use potatoes. When mashing, I always look for Agria.

REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

550g (11b,2oz) flour, 250g (8oz) mashed potatoes, 1 teaspoon salt, 50g(2oz) butter, 1 3/4 teaspoon dried yeast, 1 dessertspoon sugar, 1 beaten egg, 210ml warm milk (just above blood temperature), beaten egg for glaze.

In a large bowl sift flour and salt, rub in potato and butter.

Mix sugar and yeast, add to the warm milk, set aside for 5 minutes in a warm place then add the beaten egg to the mix. Add this wet mix to the flour mix and work into a dough adding more flour if it is too sticky. Knead until it is silky smooth, place in an oiled bowl, cover and leave to rise for 1 1/2 hours.

Punch down and divide into 18 pieces, knead and shape into rolls, place onto greased tray and cover with a plastic bag, leave for 3/4 hour to rise again.

Brush with the beaten egg and top with seeds of your choice place in preheated oven (200c) cook for 20 minutes.

*If you want to make the dough earlier it will keep for a week in the fridge. After working to a dough place in a bowl cover with a plate and place in the fridge. After 24hours punch down and cut a cross onto the surface and turn the dough. Replace the lid and return to fridge. When you are ready to use it bring back to room temperature, shape into rolls and carry on. This also makes a hearty pizza base.

POTATOES IN THE OVEN

Peel 5 large potatoes, slice and layer into a glass or pottery dish, sprinkling in a little salt and small amount of chopped onion, garlic, maybe some herbs etc to your taste as you go. Microwave for 10 minutes, remove and cool a little.

Mix 125ml sour cream, 2 tablespoons flour and 3/4cup milk, pour over the potatoes, grate some cheese over the top (optional) and bake at 180c for 30 minutes.

GARDENING

- Time to crank up the vege garden. Try some heirloom tomatoes, cos lettuce and other mixed greens. Mulch for water retention, by January you'll be glad you did!
- Plant fast growing herbs like coriander, parsley and rocket before it gets too hot or it will bolt.
- Continue to 'mound up' spuds as it's the soil around the stems that encourages heavy crops of potatoes.
- Spray roses with a spray acceptable to you. You can zap mildew on roses with a spray made from 1 teaspoon baking soda and 1 teaspoon detergent mixed with 2 litres water.
- Blue flowers on lavenders, rosemaries and catmint are great around vegetable gardens to get the bees visiting.
- The first strawberries will be ripe for the picking this month. However, before berries are ready, it's best to get that net in place, lest efforts be for the birds!

COASTAL GARDEN GROUP

Spring is certainly a fabulous time of year for our members with gardens flourishing and that was evident with our extremely successful Festival of Flowers which saw hundreds of blooms and beautiful floral arrangements turning the Mapua Hall into an oasis of colour.

Members are now looking at getting their hanging baskets ready for the coming summer season. Keitha King came with several baskets to demonstrate how she plants them. Starting with a layer of planting mix over which is sprinkled saturaid up to the lowest level of holes in the basket liner then plant the seedlings by pushing out from inside the basket with a special flexible planting tool that protects the plant. The process is repeated until the basket is full with three or four plants reserved for the top. No water is added until the basket is full then it needs to be sprayed several times to swell and soften the spaghnum moss liner. Carpet petunias give a better coverage but many other plants can be used including herbs and vegetables such as lettuce. Colourful baskets look lovely in archways, hanging from decks etc.

A visit to Thackwood Gardens is planned in November and our Christmas Function is being organized for December.
